Adult Sunday School FAQs


- Is there homework? No! Our class is discussion-based.

Resolutions from General Assembly

Resolution Passed concerning Disability Justice and Inclusion Another resolution presented to the General Assembly this year was GA-2513, Concerning Disability Justice and Inclusion in All Ministries Within the Christian Church (DOC) in the US and Canada. This resolution called upon the denomination to support the rights of disabled members of the DOC to a self-directed faith, baptism, a place at the table, equitable participation, exploration and development of spiritual gifts, and leadership possibilities including employment and/or the pursuit of ordination. The resolution encouraged members of the DOC to engage in training and learning opportunities to work through conscious and unconscious bias towards members of the disability community, and for regional ministries to make disability justice training available to congregations. The resolution was written in part by our own Topher Endress, and passed at the assembly with a nearly-unanimous vote. Each resolution from General Assembly offers us another opportunity to engage in the work of the church—what does 2 disability justice and inclusion look like for First Christian?

Brenda Mosby's "Energy Bus" has been on the move this month! The bus started its work cleaning out the Drennan Room, since it had been filled with several items without homes as we cleaned out of Bethany Hall. The Drennan Room was filled with pieces of art from a
