Organ Renovation Update

Since the pipe removal project in July, the organ renovation has been steadily moving forward. Reinhardt Construction began removing plaster in August, as well as performing a water test to examine where the leak in the organ chambers that damaged the plaster originated. The water test revealed that the leak remained, and Missouri Builders plans to address the leak by fixing the roof in the next few weeks.

In the midst of it all, the Stewardship & Finance Committee reviewed and approved a list of a few more additions to the upgrade of the organ while the organ parts are in the Levsen plant at this time. These additions include a list of stops that were discussed on the final day of the organ removal, but were also among a much larger list of items discussed at the beginning of the process of upgrading the organ. Levsen presented us with a proposal for the additional cost added to the contract of \$6,250.00, which Rochelle Parker and Tom Perkins pledged to pay to cover the stops. The Administrative Board approved the addition to the contract on August 15. Throughout this process, we've continued to find out more and more about our building and our organ, and we're so grateful for everyone who has made this work possible!



Historical Room Move

Historical Room Items Moved to Morris Parlor

In a move to support the expansion of the Mother's Day Out Preschool, the Administrative Board voted on August 15 to approve the use of the room previously occupied by the Historical Room for the preschool. To expand the total roster of children attending the preschool weekly, the preschool needed additional space. The Historical Room is centrally located for the preschool and is nudged between the nursery and the Keystone room, where MDO currently operates. This new preschool space allows us to extend the scope of MDO's work, and it adds to the bottom line revenues for the preschool and the church.

This move was originally discussed at the June board meeting, but was put forward as a special vote in August when we learned that a local preschool was closing their doors suddenly at the beginning of September, meaning we had a limited amount of time to offer these students space in our program. In less than two weeks following the vote, **Brenda Mosby's** energy bus moved the items out of the Historical Room and into Morris Parlor. We have so many... (cont'd on pg 3)


