### Upcoming

#### Colson Fellows Program August 2025 to May 2026



Join us for a 9-month deep dive into a Christian worldview. The Colson Fellows Program combines spiritual formation and worldview development through reading, online learning, monthly in-person discussions, a teaching practicum, and the development of a personal mission plan.

**Gain wisdom. Live Faithfully. Act Courageously.**

Christchurch is partnering with Trinity Presbyterian to host the course locally. Tuition is \$450 and will require 6-8 hours per week for reading, assignments, and monthly meetings.

#### Sacred Mental Health Level 2 Retreat August 3-5

This retreat is an advanced course following on from Sacred Mental Health Level 1. Its focus will be on attachment and trauma, how God ministers to these issues, and how we can enter into His sacred work of healing. It is for people who have attended the Level 1

retreat, or who have experience working with people who struggle with trauma and its effects, and with close relationships. It is not for people who are in an active state of crisis regarding these issues.
