A life was saved when a team member made sure a local man got to Kenya for a lifesaving Thyroidectomy. Had the team not encountered him during the trip, he would have suffocated, as he was breathing through a 3mm opening at the time of surgery


Provided 305 life-giving water filters to families and shared how Jesus is the living water


Gave out 400 t-shirts for boys, donated by Silver Creek members

At VBC this year, we had 265 kids (73 of whom have never attended Silver Creek Church), and 118 Volunteer Leaders.

At Student Life, 125-150 Middle and High School Students heard the Gospel at a connecting event this past school year.

At Silver Creek Church, our Next Generation Ministry actively invests in the lives of around 243 kids and students on a regular basis.

NextGen is asking God to provide this year:

20 more adult volunteers to invest in the lives of kids and students.

More opportunities to invite the kids and students of our surrounding area into our community and into the Good News of Jesus.

Men's and Women's Events -

184 Men attended the first Men's Summit

98 Women, on average, attended Ladies Night Out events (over five events).
