

Week 1: The Spirit Revealed

Read & Commit to Memory As A Family:

- John 14:26, “But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.”

Ask (for Kids):

- Who helps you learn about Jesus? (Answer: the Holy Spirit!)
- What do you think it means that the Holy Spirit is our “Helper”?
- Can you think of a time when God helped you remember something important?
- How does it make you feel to know God is always with you through His Spirit?

Ask (for Students):

- Why do you think Jesus calls the Spirit our Helper or Advocate?
- How does the Holy Spirit teach us today? (Answer: through Scripture, worship, conviction, others)
- What’s one area where you need the Spirit to guide or remind you of Jesus’ words this week?

Week 2: The Spirit Speaks

Read & Commit to Memory:

- John 15:26, ““But when the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father, he will bear witness about me.”

Ask (for Kids):

- Who sends the Helper (the Holy Spirit) to us?
- How does the Holy Spirit help us know who Jesus is?
- Can you think of a time when you felt helped or reminded about Jesus—maybe during church, a song, or a Bible story?

Ask (for Students):

- Jesus says the Spirit “bears witness” about Him. What does that look like in your life?
- What does the Spirit help you have confidence in Jesus about?
- Do you think Jesus wants to connect the Spirit’s witness and our witness about Him together?

Week 3: The Spirit Works

Read & Commit to Memory:

- John 16: 13-14 “When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you.”

Ask (for Kids):

- What does it mean that the Holy Spirit “guides you into all the truth”? How do you think He does that?
- The Bible says the Holy Spirit only says what He hears from Jesus. Why is that important?
- How does the Holy Spirit help us understand who Jesus is and what He wants for us?

Ask (for Students):

- What does it look like for the Spirit to “guide you into all the truth” in your day-to-day choices, habits, or friendships?
- Jesus says the Spirit speaks only what He hears from Him. How does that shape the way you think about the Bible and God’s voice?
- How have you experienced the Spirit revealing Jesus to you? (Examples: through Scripture, worship, conviction, or moments of clarity)
- What’s one area of your life where you need the Spirit’s guidance into truth right now?

Week 4: The Spirit Leads

Read & Commit to Memory:

- Ephesians 5:15-16, “Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil.”

Ask (for Kids):

- What does it mean to “walk wisely” with God?
- Why do you think we need the Holy Spirit to help us make good choices every day?
- Can you think of a time when the Holy Spirit helped you do the right thing or avoid something wrong?
- How can the Holy Spirit help you use your time in ways that make God happy?

Ask (for Students):

- What does “making the best use of your time” look like in your school, friendships, or free time?
- Why is it hard to walk wisely on our own, without the Holy Spirit?
- How can being “filled with the Spirit” change the way we think, speak, and act this week?

Week 5: The Spirit Equips

Read & Commit to Memory:

- Ephesians 4:11-12, “And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ.”

Ask (for Kids):

- Why do you think that God gives teachers, pastors, and helpers to the church?
- How does the Holy Spirit help people in the church know what to do to help others?
- Can you think of ways you can help someone at church, at home, or at school?

Ask (for Students):

- Why does Paul say that leaders in the church exist “to equip the saints”? How does the Spirit make that possible?
- How have you seen or experienced the Holy Spirit helping someone in our church serve others?
- What gifts or abilities has God given you to serve the church or your community?
