GET YOUR MONEY RIGHT

"Focus on Your Purpose"

2 Chronicles 1:7-12 and Matthew 6:33

King Solomon offers a sobering lesson on wealth - Ecclesiastes 5:10-6:2, NLT

- 10. Money never satisfies.
- 11. More wealth, more takers.
- 12. Workers sleep; the rich worry.
- 13. Hoarding hurts.
- 14. Riches vanish quickly.
- 15. We leave with nothing.
- 16. Chasing wealth is empty.

- 17. Riches bring misery.
- 18. Enjoy simple gifts.
- 19. Contentment is God's gift.
- 20. God grants joyful living.
- 1. Misused wealth is tragic.
- 2. Riches without joy equal grief.

Ecclesiastes 6:9 - Enjoy what you have!

Having wealth and riches is not inherently bad. God Himself knows how to give riches to those to whom He wants - 1 Chronicles 29:12. What is bad is the pursuit (love of) money - 1 Timothy 6:10. Now, instead of seeking after God, you serve money - Matthew 6:24. Seeking God and serving money cannot coexist at the same time.

Seeking first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness looks like obeying God in everything. It appears that I am living daily for God, advancing His cause on earth. To effectively advance God's agenda, I must work in my purpose (Ephesians 4:16). When I do this, God then adds everything I need to me.

- Embrace Your Purpose (2 Chronicles 1:8). Solomon was well aware of what God had done in his life, making him king.
- 2. Focus on Your Purpose (2 Chronicles 1:9). Solomon knew the weight and responsibility of his purpose.
- 3. **Seek According to Your Purpose (2 Chronicles 1:10)**. When God asked Solomon what he wanted, he asked in accordance with his purpose.

When you do this, God will give you more than what you ask for (Matthew 6:33 and 2 Chronicles 1:11-12).
