We have a goal of 500 souls this year and we are currently at 268, we also have a goal of 500 individuals in Life Groups and we are currently averaging 423. Pastor also shared that we are exceeding our financial goals this year. Though we have made progress, there is still work to be done.

Our Assistant Pastor, Rev. Dr. Christopher M. Moore Sr, kicked off our teaching sessions with the topic: SEEKING THE FACE OF GOD. He challenged us to seek God's help and direction in seeking the lost rather than asking God to bless what we are already doing. He also challenged us to pray concerning reaching the lost daily, as well as not to miss prayer and bible study but to pray with the body each week regarding God's corporate agenda, and to follow through with reaching the lost using God's power.

Our Senior Pastor, Rev. Dr. Addis Moore, followed up with a powerful teaching on the topic: **GETTING BETTER**.

Pastor Moore gave us four keys to getting better:

- **Learn Something New** - He told us that when we obey God, learning something new is automatic, and in the biblical sense is often associated with others and leads to production.
- **Try Something Different** - Pastor told us, when walking by faith, God stretches us, and trying something different is a natural part of our growth and development. That growth and development results in production for the Kingdom.

THE KIDNEY PROJECT

At Mt. Zion Baptist Church, we recognize the significant health disparities affecting the African American community and are committed to addressing them through education and awareness initiatives. One key effort is "The Kidney Project," which focuses on chronic kidney disease (CKD), a silent epidemic impacting approximately 37 million Americans. African Americans represent 35% of all kidney failure cases and are 4-5 times more likely to develop the condition, primarily due to higher rates of diabetes and high blood pressure.

Despite these alarming statistics, effective treatments like dialysis and kidney transplants can improve the quality of life. However, while 28.5% of those awaiting transplants are African American, only 12.9% were organ donors in 2020, highlighting the urgent need for increased awareness about kidney disease and organ donation.

To support this mission, Mt. Zion has produced an educational film that explores kidney health within African American families, encouraging open discussions about organ donation.

Pastor Moore urges our community to take action by educating themselves, joining the Friends and Family donor list, and spreading awareness through our film. Together, we can enhance the health and well-being of our community, one kidney at a time.




