

We must make coming to church a priority. Church is not just a place, but a spiritual home where they are nurtured, challenged, and supported. They might have to miss football or cheerleading practice.


I AM A DISCIPLE

CELEBRATING 20 YEARS OF DEDICATED SERVICE

Over 20 years ago, Pastor Moore wanted to broadcast the Mt. Zion services to keep homebound members connected to the church family. But he didn't want to go on air without a professional level production. In 2003, he came across a recording produced by Bro. Dexter Prevo. Impressed by the quality and attention to detail, he approached Brother Prevo about leading a Media Ministry. Within a year, the ministry quickly grew and Brother Prevo was on staff full-time as Media Coordinator.

The ministry quickly expanded to multiple networks and online streaming and what began as an outreach to the homebound became an opportunity to *"take a message from Pastor Moore and cast it to the world"* (Deacon Corey Dunigan). With Pastor Moore's vision and Reverend Chris' oversight, Brother Prevo has taken the Media Ministry *"from a single camera to building a studio"* (Rev. Doreen Gardner). This has included everything from adding on-screen lyrics and Scripture to closed captioning for the hearing impaired, and everything in between! Brother Prevo's professionalism and quality of work was apparent in all he did and he passed those values on to everyone on his team, earning a reputation for "no retakes."

Brother Prevo's Ministry perfectly positioned Mt. Zion to spread the Gospel message worldwide when the COVID-19 pandemic hit and many were experiencing a spiritual hunger for the Lord. Viewership skyrocketed and with over 1.5 million views on youtube, the impact of the ministry has far exceeded anyone's expectations. God took a desire to keep members connected to the church and used it to spread the Gospel message far beyond the walls of Mt. Zion, and He transformed the passionate hobby of one man into a calling that will have eternal impact on too many to count.

Brother Prevo's powerful influence and leadership has been deeply felt, and at his retirement reception on November 9th, tears were shed, hugs were shared, and Kleenex was passed as members of the Mt. Zion family came to the microphone one by one to share the impact he has made on them. *"He challenged me to see something I didn't see in myself"* (Brother Jason Berry). *"(He) helped me realize my love for cameras and graphics."* (Sis. Ari Milliner).

Scripture reminds us that our bodies are gifts from God:

"Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit...? Therefore honor God with your bodies" (1 Corinthians 6:19-20)

As we begin a new season, it is a fitting time to take an honest look at our health and consider the habits that strengthen or weaken our physical well-being.


