



2025-2026 School, Medical, Football & Christmas Sponsorship

Greetings from Liberia! This email serves to give a brief update on the young people who your donations have so impacted over this last year. As you know, through your giving, I help to sponsor a few deserving young people in school. One of the greatest difficulties most parents face in Liberia, is helping their children to receive an education. Public schools are scarce, understaffed and underequipped and often located a long distance from some children. Due to this, it is often unfeasible to send smaller children to public school. Local private schools are a much better option.

For an average of around \$175, you can sponsor a child to attend school and buy their basic school supplies and uniform for the entire year. This gift is sometimes the difference between the child remaining in a family or being sent to an "orphanage". You can give any amount and designate it as "school fees" and it will help an underprivileged child to go to school.

Another great obstacle for parents is a child's medical needs. I continue to

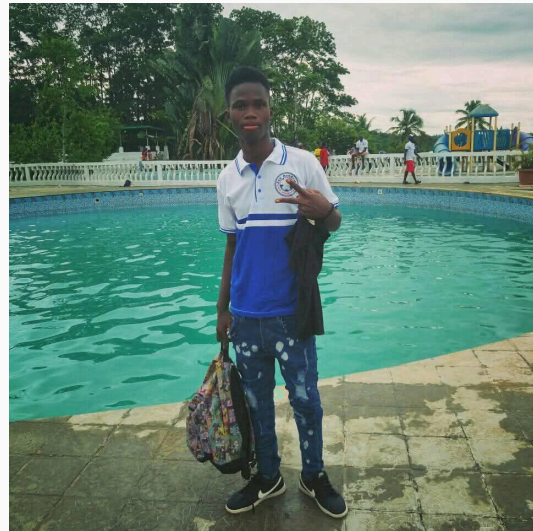
sponsor life-changing epilepsy meds at \$20 a month for Genesis Supue. There have been other medical emergencies involving severe and sudden illnesses that I am often asked to intervene. This is sometimes the difference between life and death. You can give any amount and designate it as "Medicines" and it will help to provide medical care.

Our after school football team has really taken off. I was able to provide practice "bibs" for about 1/2 the team. Any donation from you would help us to buy additional practice jerseys, team jerseys, footballs and possibly soccer cleats for some of the children. Would you consider giving towards this ministry? If you or your church are able to conduct a soccer gear "drive" and collect gently used soccer cleats, jerseys, socks or shin guards, that would be a blessing! There are means to ship such donations to Liberia. Message me for more information if you are interested in conducting such a drive.

Christmas is right around the corner! Every year, your generous donation allows us to have a small Christmas program for the children in the neighborhood. We normally pair it with the Christmas program where the gospel is shared. Last year we have out a small gift and a bag of treats to over 100 children. For many, this is the only toy and treat they will receive that day! We shared the gospel and played games. You can donate any amount and designate it as "Christmas" and it will help to provide for this party.

Below you will find a few photos of children who have been sponsored in the past and a few possibilities for new sponsorships should the funds come in. Please consider helping me to help these children to find dignity through education!





The first picture above are the children from Ma Bessie's home, originally orphans from ELWUO, **William, Morris, Grace, Joseph and Eleanor**. It has been a challenging year for these young people. As they get older, they have become less serious about their studies. I am implementing new requirements. Any students receiving failing grades will be put on probation and must complete a period with no red marks before being allowed back on the program. William, top left, has returned to live with his mother in the interior. Grace, lower left, gave birth to a baby girl last month. Their sponsorships are therefore discontinued. Pray for Morris, Joseph and Eleanor as they work on their probation and as decisions are made regarding their schooling going forward. Ma Bessie thanks you for your prayers and your ongoing support of her children.

Rosemary Onuma - She is the daughter of Napoleon and Lovetee Onuma, faithful members of our church. I began her sponsorship while Napoleon was completing his college education. Rosemary always excels in her studies. I would like to add her younger sister, Success to the sponsorship program. She is 4 years old and ready for the ABC class. She is actually the daughter of Lovetee's sister and is being fostered. Nap & Lovetee thank you for your support of Rosemary and are praying you will consider sponsoring Success.

Tutu David - I first met Tutu at Temple Baptist Church many years ago. She lives with her mother and elderly grandparents. Her mother has not been able to find consistent employment. When I first met Tutu she had never even been to school. She is now ready for 8th grade. She is normally the "deuce" of her class, meaning she has top grades. Tutu and her mother thank you and ask God to bless you for your support.

Abraham Yoewah - AB is a member of my Sunday School class and he and his grandma attend our church. AB lives with his grandma, mother and baby sister. Neither has regular full-time employment. AB has had some challenges in school this year but is committed to working harder in the upcoming year.

Genesis Supue - Genesis is also a member of my Sunday School class. He is one of the student leaders

at the young boys Football Club. He is really growing spiritually and in leadership. He lives with his father and grandmother, smaller brothers and sister. I help Genesis with epilepsy meds and he is now able to play football and other sports with his friends. He is very athletic and is entering his Senior year of high school. He is currently ranked 2nd in his class. His father thanks you for your support.

In addition to these children, if funds would allow, I would like to help Steven & OG Fayiah with their son's fees. **Emmanuel Sahr Fayiah**, "Sahr Baby" is Titus best friend and a very clever young man. Steven does not have regular employment. He works as a construction contractor as jobs become available. OG works as a housekeeper but they are expecting a new baby and she will soon be quitting her job to care for the baby.

Jeremiah Benson, "Bennyman" is a boy who lives next door. He, his mother and 2 brothers moved into the home about 6 months ago. His mother was abandoned by their father. She has a small market stand and sells cold water. Benny is a faithful member of my Sunday School class and our football team. If there is any work going on in the yard, he is here helping. I would really like to add him to the sponsorship list.

Matthew Wilson is the 11 year old son of my night security man, Guanue Wilson. Mr. Wilson is very faithful to our church and his family. His wife lives in Nimba on their farm, and he came to the city to send his children to better schools. His older daughters are attending a local public school. Matthew attends there also, but it is a very far distance and a very long and potentially dangerous walk. I would like to see Matthew attend one of the closer, local schools if possible. With your help, I could help Mr. Wilson with those extra expenses.

John, the little boy with CP in the picture at the opening of the email comes to our Sunday School class. He lives with his grandpa, grandma and mother in a zinc hut, guarding a property for the landowners. His grandpa has attempted to keep John in school but has struggled with his fees. I would really like to help him keep John in school. It is very extraordinary that a child like John would be valued enough by his family for them to pay school fees for him.

Samuel, Jeremiah and Josiah Gbardoe are the sons of a church member who recently passed away. They live with their Mom and grandma in the old church building. Their mother cleans houses but it is very difficult for her to pay school fees and the boys sometimes go with no food. Your support would help these boys so their mother doesn't have to make a choice between school and food. Samuel has recently accepted the Lord as his savior and desires to be baptized.

There are so many others, and based on how the support comes in, I will add children to sponsorship. Thank you again for your support of this very important ministry!
