The church learned a valuable lesson: they need to take better care of their pastor! And Oso learned that he can trust God for anything!



Carolyn and I were able to return to Yucatan in October. It was encouraging to see the church full of happy people and great to see all that's happening in the villages. It was a blessing for me personally to be able to preach and share various times.
