A Course on Worship by Dr. Smith

During the second week of November, Dr. Dave Smith was very gracious to teach a modular course on worship to the D.Min. students. Twenty-eight students from all over Myanmar attended the class for a week. It has helped them to better understand worship biblically.



Pastors' Seminar

During the last week of November, I was honored to be a speaker at a pastors' seminar in Kalay Myo, Sagaing division. Due to the ongoing civil war, the seminar was almost canceled. However, the Lord worked things out in such a way that there was a short opening during the week of the seminar. We ended up having about 80 pastors. I was assigned to teach on the subject of counseling.



Christmas Evangelism at Mayan

On the 6th of December, it was such a delight to celebrate Christmas at Mayan, Irrawaddy Division, which is about 2:30 hours drive from Yangon. About 70 people attended, and some of them were unsaved. We preached the Gospel message.



Christmas Evangelism at Kayin Pattaw

On the 13th of December, I took a team from our church to Kayin Pattaw, which is about 2:30 hours drive from Yangon. Our church planter, Pastor Thu Zaw Lin, did a great job of inviting about 250 people, most of whom were unsaved. Praise the Lord for the preaching of the gospel message.



Fifth Baptismal Service

On the 14th of December, six new believers obeyed the Lord through water baptism at the new campus. They all came from a Buddhist background. A Burmese bible was presented to each of them. Please pray that they will grow in the Lord as we do follow-ups with them. The worship service was followed by the Lord's supper. Twenty-eight believers partook of it.



Christmas at the New Campus

On the 21st of December, over one hundred children and about 250 adults came to the Christmas celebration at the campus. In order to show God's free gift of salvation to these Buddhists, we gave them gifts of *longyi* and *thamain* to the adults, and water bottles to the children. Our Bible college students performed an exceptional Christmas drama, which was followed by the preaching of the gospel message. After the service, everyone enjoyed *Mohinga* (Burmese traditional food).



Christmas Evangelism at Bago

On the 27th of December, I got to preach the last Christmas message in Bago, which is about two hours drive from Yangon. About a hundred people came to the meeting, which was followed by a delicious meal and wonderful fellowship.
