### A SPECIAL BLESSING:

It has been many months since I have had the strength to travel or preach. I have had to cancel conferences and Sunday meetings.. That has probably been one of the hardest parts of this cancer journey. But one of our local supporting pastors graciously invited me to come and report and preach this past Sunday. We prayed and asked the Lord to give me the needed strength and He did. I had to preach sitting down but God helped me and I believe He was honored and glorified. What a blessing! I will begin my new pancreatic cancer treatment next week. Please pray that all will go well.

### CANCER REPORT:

About three months ago they started chemotherapy for my pancreatic cancer. They have told me that my prostate cancer is "manageable." After two treatments they had to discontinue the chemo because of side effects. Consequently, I had to spend almost two weeks in the hospital and nine days in rehab, treating the side effects and building up my strength. It was determined that I was not a candidate for chemotherapy so I will be having a radiation treatment called Cyberknife. We ask our prayer partners to please lift us up in prayer. This has been a long journey, but we are confident that God is still in control.
