Maybe she had never done that before. She has severe eczema on her hands and hard to understand sometimes. Yesterday she won a card game, and should have the puzzle finished tomorrow. She read Scripture aloud before her peers and seems more sure of herself. She is in foster care, given up by her parents because of their addictions. She doesn't feel anyone at her house really cares for her. I see many kids like this. So, we try to show them love and inclusiveness in our activities. We want all of them to understand who Jesus is and how much He loves them.

The kids that come to safe zone are asking lots of questions. "How old is God? Can He see everything? Did both Adam and Eve eat the fruit? Weren't both naked then? In public? Some questions are easier than others to answer. The last two questions: I gave an example of a child who doesn't understand why they need to wear clothes because they don't have any understanding of shame. Adam and Eve were innocent until they sinned and now they had shame and wanted to cover themselves. It led to talking about our need for a Saviour. In many ways, its sad to see their ignorance of the Bible but a great joy to be the ones to bring knowledge to young hearts. Both here and on the reserve.
