children. We want to change what has happened in the past. Giving more responsibility to the guardians. We just don't have the space or the workers. One Sunday, Cindy had 18 kids and last week 15. The kids listen well and seem to enjoy the time. This past week, reaffirmed the need for a second worker. Deborah was home for the weekend and helped.

I had made a rule that if a child turns 10 before Christmas, they can come to Safe Zone. That is the case with Chelsey. Still 9 years old, she is the tiniest one we have had yet. She lives just down the street, loves animals and has such a tender heart. Her last question to me was, "If your pet dies, do they go to Heaven?" I thought it best to say, I don't really know, but I do know that in the end, animals are in the new earth and they like each other. That seemed to comfort her heart. She is like a sponge, soaking in what is being taught. Pray for her. She is the youngest in a mixed family.

We have a great desire to bring people to a true understanding of God. A few weeks ago, one of our church attendees referred a lady to Bob because of the disturbing nightmares she was having. Bob talked to her at length leading her to trust in Christ as her Savior. Praise the Lord!

Her two kids have attended Children's church with another family member. This next Sunday, she came with her children. Then, a young lady who began attending our mission several years ago, texted Cindy on the anniversary of her mother's death. She wanted to do something, so the two of them went to the cemetery, sang a few songs, read Scripture and sat on a bench talking. We have prayed much for her and the family. On that day, she put her trust in Christ. She had been coming to church for several weeks before and continues to come now. She has been sober for more than a year. She is reading her Bible and understanding it. God is so good!

He arrived home shortly after we arrived. They want to be married before the cancer makes that impossible. So, we anticipate that a wedding will take place in the next couple of weeks. Bob is not licensed in Canada but can perform a wedding and have a 'justice of the peace' present to do the legal aspect. While Cindy was filling out the licensing papers with her, Bob was talking to him. A short time later, he was praying to trust Jesus as his Savior.

It sure seems that we are busier than ever. We have been called upon to counsel couples and individuals and have more visiting than we have time to do. We still have the Safe Zone after-school program two days a week. We have a younger new group of kids this year and they are full of questions.

Please pray God will give us strength in the days ahead. We see a great need for a younger couple to come and work alongside us. Mishkeegogamang has over 1000 residents. There is such a great need for the Gospel and true understanding of Scripture. There are more kids than we could ever accommodate or have the strength to work with. They so desire someone to love them. Would you consider coming north to minister in this beautiful country? The harvest is great! The time is short!
