The last couple of months have been a mixture of events here in Bolivia. Thankfully, we are all well, although, Ernesto was in a car accident. This time, the back tire exploded, and caused the car to flip over. Ernesto was not injured whatsoever since it was a very "light" accident, praise the Lord! Our car was already struggling with different repairs like the transmission, alternator, etc. Since it was a used vehicle, we knew that it was not going to last long, especially with the kinds of roads we have here in Magdalena. We have received some quotes of how much it will cost for a new vehicle. We found out that a 15 passenger van, which would be a great blessing to bring people to church especially during rainy season which will start at the end of November, will cost \$23,000. We are earnestly praying for this vehicle. Would you please pray with us about it, too?

Ernesto was also in the hospital with a stomach infection, again. This happened at the end of September, and he is still recovering from it. He has been on a strict diet, which he is not happy about. As you can tell, Ernesto is the sickly one :) Please continue to keep him in your prayers for good health and strength.

Bolivia's presidential elections will take place on October 19. Please be in prayer for Bolivia. Pray that the right person will be put in place so that the nation will be in a better place for God to work. Also, please pray that the elections will help put the gasoline and U.S. dollar situations in order among other things.

God is growing the discipleship program! We had our first Continue Discipleship Graduation in which Vania, Ericka, and Laidy graduated. As we mentioned in our previous letter, the men have been a little slower in being discipled, but we are thankful that now they are in it. Ernesto has two more men that are going through discipleship. One of them is Mr. Rigoberto, a 67 year old man. Something great about this is that Ernesto encouraged him to be discipled pointing out that so many people that were greatly used by God in the Bible were of age, and that He is the same God that can use him also.
