When our men are not in school, we take the opportunity to minister to the youth in the detention centers across the nation.

News From the Field:

Summer has gone by so quickly. The Lord has blessed the services at the Juvenile Detention Center. We have had 18 teens trust the Lord as their Savior. One week we had 4 pray to be Saved! The next week after services one young man came up and asked, "Can I still get Saved?" He was uncertain the week before and was worried that he had missed the opportunity to get saved. Praise the Lord, he prayed right there and ask the Lord to save Him. We are starting discipleship with the teens. Pray they will grow in the Lord. Not only were most of the Bibles in the Detention Center library not KJV they were also very worn and starting to fall apart. I ask for permission to replace their Bible with New Rock of Ages Study Bibles. The teens are now asking for their own Study Bible.
