Something special is happening at PCOM. We are a growing church in many ways, but what's behind that growth is the real story. - We piloted an Art of Fatherhood class through Parent Well with numbers that defied expectation.
- We increased our PrimeTime offerings to support our community of seniors.
- We hired four new people to support our ministries (read about them on page 19!).
- We innovated our music and arts ministry, both in the sanctuary and through Creative Roots, bringing beauty to our community.

As we prepare for 2026, we seek to continue growing deep and wide. We have outstanding staff and elders. We have a balanced budget, a generous congregation, and an abundance of love for one another. We continue soaking in the goodness of God and seeking to share that goodness with everyone we meet.

During 2024, the Buildings and Grounds committee developed a schedule of the repair and replacement actions needed to maintain all the major assets that comprise our property and structures, including a forecast of the expected costs by year. This past fiscal year, with support from the Finance committee and the Session, we began execution of the plan.

Among the first projects tackled were the fumigation of all our buildings in August 2024 to address termite infestation, followed by phase 1 of repair and replacement of wood damaged by termites and dry rot. These projects totally shut down on-site church operations for days. It was odd, perhaps even startling, to see all our buildings wrapped in blue and green tarpaulin covers. Thanks to amazing cooperation from everyone, there were no significant disruptions to any PCOM programs or activities.

## **CARE MINISTRIES**

So we've restructured our Care Ministries to a teambased approach, including a memorial service care team, memorial responsibilities for Office Administrator, Dianne Lam, and leadership of our deacons and coordination of pastoral care through me (Pastor Courtney).

Our deacons represent a dynamic team of folks who each care for a particular neighborhood of PCOM members, offering prayer, connection, and spiritual care. We are grateful to be able to provide holistic, nurturing support for many of the practical needs of our congregation as well, including meals, communion visits for those who are homebound, and hospital and care home visits.

This year one of our deacon care teams had the opportunity to bring the Lord's Supper to one of our longtime members in his home just days before he died. The visit was a blessing to all three of the people involved.

We are also celebrating our third year of GriefShare, a program dedicated to walking with people during seasons of loss. Jackie Kosewick continues to oversee this popular and important program—just one more way we at PCOM seek to make the hope of Jesus present to our neighbors through emotional wholeness.

## **CREATIVE ROOTS**



At Creative Roots, we believe that music and art are powerful gifts meant to be shared—and that our community needs spaces where creativity can grow, healing can happen, and people can connect. This new ministry is a response to that need. As an outreach of our church, Creative Roots exists to serve our broader community by providing accessible music and arts opportunities for all, with a special focus on offering free classes to students of Title 1 schools. Through this ministry, we hope to reflect Christ's love in practical, creative ways.

This spring, our school age musicians performed at Sunrise Senior Living. We had music by tiny violin players, young pianists, and vocalist. The residents love to see the children and hear their music! One young singer sang "Can't Help Falling in Love," by Elvis Presley. The residents enthusiastically sang along with the student performer. That moment reminded us that music is not just a skill—it's a ministry of healing and connection across generations.

### **Praises**

- Growth in numbers and hearts: Since January 2024, we've served over 150 music students across private and group lessons—each one growing in skill and confidence. Since May 2024, we have served well over 950 children and adults in a wide variety of arts classes, the Mission Viejo Night Market, Sourdough Workshops, and intergenerational church art projects.
- Expansion of our mission: In May 2024, we launched our visual arts program and became Creative Roots Arts and Music Conservatory, broadening our reach and welcoming even more creative souls, and making the arts accessible for even more people.
- Community impact: Our free after school art classes at Viejo Elementary last spring, supported by PCOM Missions, brought creativity and joy to children who may not otherwise have access to the arts.
- Meaningful performances: From the Open Mic Coffeehouse in the Youth Room to recitals in the

PCOM Sanctuary and at Sunrise Senior Living, our students are using their gifts to bless others and grow in confidence and purpose.

## **Hopes**

We are hopeful to see what God will do as we launch the OC Kids Choir (grades K-5) and the Creative Roots Singers (grades 6-8) this fall! These community music ensembles will not only teach vocal skills and technique, but create a space where kids and youth can grow in friendship, teamwork, and have fun through music.

## **Prayers**

Please pray with us as we seek the Holy Spirit's guidance in developing and fundraising for after school arts and music programs for local Title 1 schools. Our dream is to offer free after school art classes for kids to explore, process, and express themselves. We also hope to offer free group music coaching in band and orchestra instruments and make private lessons more accessible through discounted rates—so that every child, regardless of background, has the opportunity to flourish through music.

## PARENT WELL

Parent Well exists to connect, educate, and encourage parents, particularly during some of the most trying times of parenthood. We seek to support families from PCOM and beyond, offering a resource to both our church and the greater community.

Parent Well concluded its first year of 12-week semester courses in May. We continued to add participants to both the Parents of Babies class and the Parents of Tweens class throughout the year and the feedback from participants has been overwhelmingly positive. We feel that God is in our midst, both in the planning and in the strong bonds between parents being created within our classes. In addition, we piloted an Art of Fatherhood course for 4-weeks in April, led by our teachers with help from Pastors Daryl and Jackson. It was filled beyond capacity. We plan to run that course again this fall.

## **Praises**

- We successfullly reached outside of the PCOM community to grow our classes
- The Art of Fatherhood had 27 men enrolled
- Our Parent Well courses are meeting a need for information, support, and spiritual direction
- Pastor Jackson piloted an Empty Nesters connection group in his home to minister to another unique group of parents

## Wonderful News:

While it looks like our membership numbers have declined, that is largely due to the fact that over the past year we've cleaned our membership rolls, removing those who have moved or are worshiping elsewhere. So while membership numbers have gone down on paper, they simply now more accurately reflect who's here.

## ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE

PCOM's elders are commissioned with the spiritual and fiduciary responsibility for guiding our church. As such, they are commissioned with discerning PCOM's's annual budget and our overall long-term vision for stewarding resources for the sake of maximum ministry vitality and kingdom impact.

In that spirit, our elders have called us to continue stretching into a season of strategic investment and imagination in line with our vision. And our congregation continues to respond faithfully to this invitation! Having stretched in our budgeting process for 2024-25, we only finished with a church operating deficit of \$19,143. Both our finance team and our elders continue to discern that our current strategic investments are prudent and sustainable given our level of reserves, clarity of vision, and ministry momentum.

Much of this strategic investment has been sustained through several one-time bequests and one-time financial windfalls, including the use of Covid-era relief funds. These investments have helped to stoke new ministry momentum, catch up on deferred maintenance, and plant new ministries.

Given that those one-time funds are now depleted, our prayer, hope, and invitation now is for the congregation to

continue joining us in maintaining this momentum and stewarding the resources-from ministries, to staff, to facilities-that God has entrusted to our care.

### **Praises**

- Total annual pledged giving total up \$85,000, with 30 new pledgers.
- Sunday giving was up 1.9% this year and up 15.2% over the past two years.
- Bequests and one-time windfalls increased total assets by over \$1m.
- We invested \$142,800 in capital improvements on campus, including refurbishing the Great Room.
- Seeded new ministries in Parent Well and Creative Roots with \$36,907 initial funding with the intention that those programs become self-sustaining.
- Developed a long-term facilities maintenance forecast, in partnership with Buildings and Grounds, that successfully guided our first annual cap-ex budget and directs our desire to raise endowment funds to cover long-range facilities needs.

- Launch a two-step PCOM Legacy Campaign that aims at furnishing PCOM's long-term financial and facilities stewardship:
  - Step 1: Pay off our mortgage within 3 years
  - Step 2: Raise our endowment to \$5 million within 5-7 years
    - Note: Based upon our newly developed long-term capital expense forecast, we expect annual maintenance needs to grow from the current ~\$175,000/year to ~\$300,000/year within the next 5 years.
