How to read a parable: we are the audience, not the Savior
I. God after us.
The whole world is beloved by God. (John 3:16)
II. God never

III. God when we are found.
The shepherd joyfully puts the sheep on his shoulders to bring it home. (Luke 15:5)

IV. Who is Jesus calling you to in seeking after? Who needs to hear that they belong?
