This especially translates into our relationship with God. Without even knowing it, we feel entitled to certain things from God. If it doesn't go our way or our prayers aren't answered as we prayed them, nor in the timeframe we asked for, we can get jaded. Thus, we treat God as though he owes us or that we deserve certain things from him. Allow me to burst any kind of entitlement bubble you might have with God. God owes you nothing, yet He has given you everything. That's right. Not only does God not owe you a thing, His Word tells us the only thing we are owed, because of our sinful nature, is death, destruction, and eternal punishment. But thanks be to God that He doesn't treat us as we deserve.

But God treats us much better than we deserve, and because of Christ Jesus, he freely accepts us and sets us free from our sins. God sent Christ to be our sacrifice. Christ offered his life's blood, so by faith in him we could come to God. -Romans 3:24-25 CEV

So, while what we are "owed" is death, God put that punishment on His Son Jesus, setting us free from the law of sin and death, and making us right in His eyes. Thus, though we don't deserve it, we are given the love, grace, mercy, power, passion, resources, and blessings of a personal relationship with God. From that perspective everything in our life is a gift from God. When you live with an attitude that you are blessed with all you have rather than entitled to all you have, it gives you a whole new attitude and outlook on life. Suddenly how you view what's in your hands is completely transformed. It's no longer my time but His. It's no longer my gifts and talents, but His. It's no longer my stuff, my resources, my money, but it's all his. I deserve and am entitled to none of it, but I've been blessed with all of

Family of Rolling Plains,

I have been doing a little research for an upcoming event and thought I would share some information about the power of prayer.

In my research, I found information about a study on how prayer changes the brain. Growing up, I was told that when we became a certain age, our brains stopped growing. Well, if our brains stop growing, how can the following verse be true?

Romans 12:2 NIV "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is this good, pleasing and perfect will."

How can our brain be renewed if it does not change? Did God know something science did not know yet? Of course, He did!

In 2003, a radiologist named Andrew Newberg used a new machine called functional magnetic resonance imaging to study the brains of people who prayed. Andrew gathered people from different faiths and asked them to pray for 12 minutes a day. Andrew captured images of a control group that were not going to pray and this group before they started their darly prayer as a baseline. The images Andrew collected after the experiment proved that our brains could grow in adulthood, therefore agreeing with the Bible. The group that prayed showed a scientifically significant increase in volume and metabolic activity in the part of the brain that connects emotions and thoughts, creating an ability to be more loving and forgiving. He also found that the group who prayed had a decrease in the fight or flight response, which allows one to respond to situations without overwhelming emotions like anger and fear.

I am sure glad I believe in an all-knowing God. What I want you to take from this is that prayer can transform your brain and your life it says so in the Word of God and is backed up by science.


