This guide is meant to help you go deeper into your daily time with God as you study His word and respond to Him through prayer.

Space is provided for you to write your observations, applications, prayers, and sermon notes. We encourage you to make this a part of your daily time with God and to approach His word devotionally, not just academically.

How amazing would it be if these truths were on our minds and written in our hearts throughout the day? We hope to see this book make a difference in our day-to-day lives and ultimately conform us to who God desires us to be in Christ.

EPHESIANS 6:10-17

10 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of His might. 11 Put on the full armor of God, so that you will be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil. 12 For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places. 13 Therefore, take up the full armor of God, so that you will be able to resist in the evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. 14 Stand firm therefore, having girded your loins with truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, 15 and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; 16 in addition to all, taking up the shield of faith with which you will be able to extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. 17 And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

INTRODUCTION

THE SOAP METHOD

We will be using the SOAP method of Bible study each week. It's a simple way of studying God's word that doesn't require a seminary degree or Greek language skills! It will encourage you to slow down and dig deeper as you study the book of Ephesians. "SOAP" is an acronym for Scripture, Observation, Application, and Prayer. This method will help you avoid glossing over essential truths in God's word, and it will help you apply His truths to your life.



S - Scripture

Physically write out the Bible verse. This will help you slow down and take note of things you might not otherwise observe.



O - Observation

Write down everything that stands out to you - people, places, repetition of words, main ideas, or key themes.



A - Application

Is there a direct challenge from the text for me to apply? What other truths can I apply from the text? What changes do I need to make?



P - Prayer

Spend time praising God for who He is, confessing any known sin, thanking Him for the blessings in your life, and asking him to provide for your needs.
