Children in Worship

Parents, relax. Children wiggle. We understand and we're so glad you're here with your little one(s). Consider sitting near the front to see if this helps your child see and engage in the service. Explain the different parts of the service to your child (singing God's praise, listening to God's word, praying God's will, etc). Children won't understand all the words they will hear, but they understand body language. Let them learn that God is worthy of our songs, prayers, and listening ears by the way you and others around them participate. If you feel that you need to leave the worship center for a time with your child, feel free to do so, but please come back. As Jesus said, "Let the children come to me; do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God." (Mark 10:14).

Scriptural Call to Praise

"Hear the word of the Lord, you rulers of Sodom! Give ear to the teaching of our God, you people of Gomorrah! "What to me is the multitude of your sacrifices? says the Lord; I have had enough of burnt offerings of rams and the fat of well-fed beasts; I do not delight in the blood of bulls, or of lambs, or of goats. "When you come to appear before me, who has required of you this trampling of my courts? Bring no more vain offerings; incense is an abomination to me. New moon and Sabbath and the calling of convocations— I cannot endure iniquity and solemn assembly.
