

FAFC Questions and Interaction

1. If there a part of the message that most spoke to you the most?
2. Believing the truth that God can use us is a challenge we all face at one time or another. Moses questioned himself when God called him to lead Israel. Gideon questioned himself when God encountered him. When you think about your life, what is the biggest obstacle that you face in God using you? Sometimes it falls in a time, talent, or treasure category. Do any of these apply?
3. Often in the Bible, God used the most unexpected people to accomplish His tasks. Sometimes it was a teenager to fight a giant (David) or an elderly man to start a nation (Abraham). What does that say about God's choices? Do you think you are unusable or useable? 1 Corinthians 1 goes on to say, "God uses the foolish things to confound the wise." How does the keep us from excluding ourselves?
4. In the Mark 2 story of the four friends, they made themselves available to help their friend. Why is availability more important than ability in the story and in us? Why is it important to remember God can make up for our areas of lacking? Talk about a person who took time to make a difference in your life. How did it change you?
5. How do you think they felt in changing their friend's life? Which of the characteristics in the message of useable people might God be speaking to you? Think about a person in your life who might need to be brought to Jesus (in prayer, in love through you, or in an extension). Ask God to lead you in making a difference. Take time to pray.
