

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What did you understand about Daniel and his friends that you didn't know before?
2. What compromises does our culture pressure us to make, and how can we "make up our minds" like Daniel before those moments arise? How do you think changing Daniel and his friends' names was meant to reshape their identity, and how does our world try to redefine who we are today?
3. What does it look like to stay "unshakeable" in your faith, and how can God use that to impact others around you?
4. When have you felt pressure to "bow down" to the expectations or norms of others? What stands out to you about the phrase, "But even if He does not..."? What does that say about trusting God, even when we don't know the outcome?
5. What does Daniel's consistent prayer life teach us about spiritual habits, especially when under pressure or scrutiny at work or in public life? Have you ever been targeted or misunderstood because of your faith? How did you handle it, and what would you do differently now?
6. How does Daniel's story give you hope or courage to remain faithful, even when it feels like the "lions" are all around you?
