# A Month Marked by God's Movement

October unfolded like a gentle sunrise—steady, warm, and full of promise. Every classroom visited, every home entered, and every young heart reached became a canvas where God quietly painted transformation

Even on days when schedules were tight and logistics were challenging, the team moved with grace, carrying hope into places longing for light. By the time the month ended, the impact felt less like a record of activities and more like a testimony of God's faithfulness at work.



#### Where Young Hearts Met the Gospel

Across Nairobi's schools, laughter, curiosity, and Scripture met in beautiful harmony. Week after week, children sat eager and expectant as the team unpacked the simple but life-changing truths of the New Testament. The gospel pentrated their hearts.



Whether it was the 450 teenagers at Theta Secondary or the tiny learners in PP1 at Golden Heights, each session planted seeds that will grow long after October's pages close.





These weren't just lessons taught—they were moments where identity, purpose, and faith quietly took root.



## Doors Opening in Unexpected Places

October also brought unexpected opportunities, especially at Kamae Juvenile Prison, where 30 girls encountered comfort, prayer, and the message of hope. Conversations once marked by uncertainty slowly turned into moments of stillness and trust as the Gospel was gently shared.

New partnerships began forming—like at First Joy Academy and with churches met during the Inheritance Summit—each one representing a future doorway for deeper ministry. It felt as though God was widening the path, inviting PIPES to walk boldly into spaces ripe for transformation.





### Namanga Stirring Revival at the Edges

In Namanga, the dusty roads and open fields echoed with renewed life as discipleship classes, fellowships, and home visits continued with quiet persistence. The prayer center welcomed a group from Engamboli—26 people who came burdened but left strengthened, with one giving their life to Christ

Women were equipped with literacy tools, girls received dignity through menstrual health support, and a new partnership at Jesus Revival Church began shaping a future of youth and children's discipleship. Every activity, small or large, became a reminder that transformation often begins with a single willing heart.







#### A Harvest Worth Celebrating

By the end of October, the team had reached 3,256 people, and 23 of them boldly said yes to Jesus—a number that carries eternity within it. The month was not without challenges, especially in transport and follow-up systems, yet every obstacle felt overshadowed by the undeniable evidence of God's grace.
