A few months ago, Ariel Koerner, our Minister for Young Families, approached me about a crazy idea she and the children came up with. They wanted to do an entire worship service led by the children. They already had so many ideas and dreams about what they wanted it to look like. I never dreamed it would be as meaningful and magnificent as it turned out to be. I'll be reflecting on that service for a long time to come.

There are so many parts to the service that I treasure. First, I love how many people showed up to support

our children! We had more people in worship on Sunday than any other Sunday all year. What a testament to the way we value children in our church! Many of the children were feeling nervous before the service and I heard so much encouragement coming from the congregation as you entered the sanctuary. I really do feel like we have the very best church. Second, I love that the choir sat on the front few rows to be able to smile and sing loudly back at the children to give them confidence. That was incredibly loving. Third, the baby dedication was so meaningful. To have new families stand up and show us by example that they are committing to raising their children in the church is inspiring. It is a sign of hope rising up all around us. (**Also, I keep making babies cry!)

Fourth, the children were SO well prepared. They sang each word to our worship songs and did so beautifully. It takes a lot of courage to stand up on that platform and speak into a microphone. I could not do it when I was their age! The first time I spoke in 'big church' as a college student, I could barely get the words out and I could hear my heartbeat in my ears. The sweet girls who lead us in our responsive reading and the little blond buddies who prayed over us did so powerfully. Perhaps one of the best parts of the service was watching children take up the offering. I was dying! It occurred to me that most of them had never seen it done before. You missed the best part when they dropped the money at the back and had to scramble around picking it up. Priceless!

For me personally, it was really special writing a sermon with my son Luke. Every word he spoke were words that he prepared. Luke often wonders if he might be called to be a pastor or a missionary. Who knows. What I know is that he felt safe enough and loved enough in this place to preach his very first sermon. Thank you for being the kind of church that believes in the next generation. You are shaping the future of the church by how you love others and lead by example. I will treasure that day for many reasons, but mostly because the heart of the church was on display. 
