

### Letter from Sarah



Dear Church Family,

I hope you are doing well. I pray for you all the time. I am thankful to be a part of this church family. This summer we began our study in the book of Acts, and I have already learned so much. I hope you have too. Here are some of my reflections on the study so far.

God is working all the time, even in the difficult moments, he is always active and alive. When I consider the small group of men and women who were entrusted to carry the gospel to the ends of the earth, I am stunned at what a risk that seemed to be. These were not perfect people. They were not heroes. They were not immune to stress, self-promoting, self-doubt, fighting, or pride. They were not immune to misunder-standing Jesus. Despite all the things, what really mattered was that they loved Jesus. They gave their lives to following him and nothing was going to stop them, not even their own sin or failure or insecurities. God was (and is) bigger than all our problems or shortcomings or setbacks. He's God, after all!

I think we forget that sometimes. We forget that God is BIG. We forget that God is actively working in our lives, our church, and in our world. We are not independent agents trying to bring about change through our own meager means. We are children of the living God and we're not in it alone. God asks us to be faithful to him and trust him. He asks us to join him, not as children on our own, but as children of God who have his holy presence dwelling within us. Jesus said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." He is with us!

Rather than hearing Jesus's command as "Go, *you* better get to work." Maybe we should hear his commission as something like this, "Let's go. We've got work to do, you and me. Let's make disciples of all nations. Let's teach them how to live according to my heart and my will. Let's baptize new believers in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Let's do this most holy work together of reconciling the world back to God. Let's heal what sin has broken. Let's help people find freedom from sin and experience true and total forgiveness. Let's be agents of grace together. I am with you always, no exceptions. We're in this together."

Church family, we have been invited by God to partner with him in bringing hope and healing to a world fractured and in pain. We have been healed so that we can now become wounded healers ourselves and help others find healing in Christ. We have holy work to do. We get to meet people right where they are in life and help them find their way to Christ. We have new people coming to our church every single week who are seekers. They are hungry to know and understand the things of God. Many of them long to know Jesus and they need friends to help them on their journey of faith.

We've got work to do, church family. Just like the early church, we will be our best when we are caring for each other, encouraging each other, working through tough moments as family, and listening to the leading of the Spirit. God is doing something among us. Let's be brave enough to jump in with both feet and say to Jesus, "Let's do this together. I'm all in." Blessings upon blessings dear friends. ### Connect



FBCOKC offers bible study groups AND small groups as part of our discipleship ministry. We believe BOTH are vital for our spiritual lives. Below is a brief description of each and our intended goals.

#### **Bible Study Groups**

Our Bible Study Groups meet on Sunday mornings at 9:15am in various locations around the church. The goal of these groups is inherent in the name. We study Scripture in depth, led by the guidance of the Holy Spirit and gifted teachers, so that we can be transformed fully into Christlikeness. While building community and nurturing friendships are a part of our bible study groups, the heart of our bible study groups is about growing in our knowledge and understanding of God's word. Our Bible study groups are not limited by size.

#### **Small Groups**

Our small groups meet primarily on Wednesday and Sunday evenings in various locations both in homes and at the church. The main goal of small groups at FBCOKC is to grow in our relationships with one another as we grow together in faith. While we use Scripture as the foundation for our gatherings, small groups are focused on building community, cultivating friendships, and mutual encouragement. Unlike bible study groups, small groups are limited to 8-12 people per group. This smaller environment allows for more space to develop friendships, get to know new people, and share life together.

#### Should I join a Bible study group or a small group? Or both?

BOTH! Bible study groups give us space to open up our minds and hearts to the transforming power of Scripture. This is an invaluable experience for Christ followers to engage deeply with God's word. Small groups give us space to allow those biblical truths to find a home in our relationships with one another as we seek to walk together in faith.
