# Letter from Sarah



Church family, I pray for you every day. You are incredible, church! You each have your own struggles and trials that you face every day, but your faith remains relentless and strong. You inspire me. I know a lot of you have mountains you need moved right now. Me too. So together, we will trust in God's goodness to be with us no matter what. Often during worship, as the choir leads us so beautifully, I think about the testimonies that are represented up there and how God has worked in each of your lives. Most Sunday mornings, at some point during the service, I will stop singing for a moment and just listen as the church leans in closer to God as we sing of his goodness and faithfulness.

We are growing, you and I. I can see it, and I think you can feel it (if you are paying attention). I don't mean growing numerically, though that is happening. I mean that God is working in each of us, shaping who we are and how we see the world. God is working in us in a new way that I have not experienced before. I come on Sunday mornings, not just hoping, but knowing deep down that God will meet us as we gather and will work among us. It is holy. Have you sensed it? Have you felt the movement of the Spirit as we worship? Have you noticed people praying together after worship? I have. Have you noticed the new faces of people joining us every week who want to meet Jesus? God is so good.

This year as we have studied the Gospel of Luke and the book of Acts, I have been blown away by the lessons God is teaching me. Studying the stories in Acts has shaped the way I see the church and what it means to be family. It means praying for each other, supporting each other, growing and learning together, and challenging each other to be better. Being family means focusing on our mission together and keeping Jesus always before us. Sometimes, being family means working through problems together and creatively coming up with solutions together. It also means holding each other up when life falls apart.

During our worship service on August 24<sup>th</sup> we studied the story in Acts 12. It is the story of James's death and Peter's deliverance. It's a hard passage. Why does God rescue one and not the other? Why do some people get their miracle and others don't? I don't know. But I know that his goodness and power and love are all still true even when the miracle doesn't happen because sometimes it doesn't. I know that it doesn't mean God isn't there or that he is too small to do anything or too removed to care. He is our God either way. We pray anyway. We pray believing God can and will rescue us, but we trust him either way.

Friends, I am so honored that so many of you shared with me how I can pray for you. I want you to know I am praying with you each day. Praying for miracles and mercies. Praying for wisdom and courage. Praying for growth and healing. Frederick Buechner wrote this, "Even if the miracle doesn't come, keep on beating the path to God's door, because the one thing you can be sure of is that down that path you beat with even your most half-cocked and halting prayers, the God you call upon will finally come, and even if he doesn't bring you the answer you want, he will bring you himself. And maybe at the secret heart of all our prayers that is what we are really praying for." So keep praying friends. Keep looking to the God who saves us. Join with me in praying for the church and all the many needs sitting in our pews each week. Pray for God to do what only God can do. And pay attention to how he is already moving in and among us. Every day I thank God for you. Blessings to each one of you as you shine your light in every corner of the world. God is with you. You will not fail. ~Sarah

## Loving Our Neighbors at The Border

We need your help! FBCOKC is an encourager church for Elket Rodriguez. In 2020, Elket joined the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship and Fellowship Southwest as an Immigrant and Refugee Advocate and Missions Specialist. As an encourager church, we've committed to pray for Elket and support him as he serves communities and migrants in the expansive U.S. – Mexico border region, spanning four U.S. states and six Mexican states. His ministry right now is focused on The Colonias communities in south Texas.

Elket has been communicating with our Missions Team about specific needs of the immigrant communities he serves. They are desperately in need of hygiene kits and hats that can provide migrants protection from the sun. Wings, a local organization that serves adults with developmental disabilities, generously provides hygiene kits to churches and organizations across Oklahoma including our very own CareForOKC community ministry. Wings has agreed to provide us with hygiene kits for this mission project! Below is a list of items you can donate to help us complete the kits:

- Wet wipes ( travel size)
- Fingernail clippers
- Hand sanitizer (2 FL OZ size)
- Hats that provide protection from the sun (new or “like new” hats only please)
- You can also donate money to the Missions Budget and we will purchase the items

We will collect these items throughout the month of September. Look for the donation box in The Commons! In October, we will be sending a small team from FBCOKC to personally deliver these items to Elket in Harlingen, Texas and to serve with him at the Colonias in south Texas for a few days. # Building Updates

There is something sacred about this beautiful church building. Early on Sunday mornings, long before the first sound of giggling children fills our halls, before faithful Bible Study teachers arrive to welcome their classes, before the lights have been turned on, the sun shines through the east-facing stained glass windows in the sanctuary, and it is enough to stop you in your tracks. The golden glow illuminates the room filled with beautiful wooden pews that have seen generation after generation come to faith in our good God. The faces have changed, the clothing styles cycle through and come back around, but the heart of this place has stayed the same. We are a family of faith striving to be faithful to who God has called us to be in this place. This is our time.

This building we call home has been the launching pad for over a hundred churches throughout our state. Within these walls, every Sunday morning, our halls are filled with worship from around the world. We currently have three congregations in addition to ours, worshipping at our church: Trinity Chinese Baptist Church, Sudanese Christian Community Church, and Redeemed Presbyterian Church. Our building is full of life every day of the week!

Over the past five years, the Academy of Classical Christian Studies has invested over 3 million dollars in building renovations. What a tremendous blessing! We have also invested in our building and our property to make it a welcoming place for kingdom-building purposes. One area at a time, we have been updating and improving this place. Because we are caring well for our building, we can use it more and more. I want to share with you a few of the things happening in our building.

Our South parking lot is nearing the end of its reconstruction. This is part of the Academy renovations. We will have better lighting, new landscaping, and a brand new parking lot. What a blessing. Our Building and Grounds committee has been hard at work designing and planning to have a new sign made for our Robinson Street entrance. We have received two gifts from generous church members to help us cover nearly the whole cost of the new sign when we are finally ready to move forward. The courtyard is about to be updated by a young Academy student for his Eagle Scout project. He has been working with a horticulturalist as well as a wholesale local nursery to provide the materials. He will raise the funds, recruit volunteers, work with our Building and Grounds Committee, and lead the effort to update the space. He plans to work on this project in September. What a blessing!

Beginning in October, the Academy will start work on replacing the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor roof on the Hobbs building. When that work is complete, they will begin renovating the third floor to have it ready for the 2026/2027 school year with new classrooms and a library meeting space. We plan to host an open house for the church when renovations are complete!

This year, we rented the gym to local sports teams, including soccer, volleyball, and basketball clubs. We hosted more weddings and have plans to host even more in 2026. We hosted the YMCA Summer Camp for 4 to 6-year-olds and loved every minute of it. We received nearly \$5000 through this partnership with the YMCA. We offered our south parking lot to the Thunder during the amazing parade this summer and used our north parking lot for event parking, raising around \$3300. We rented portions of our parking lot for 5 weeks this spring to a local construction company needing parking for their workers. This year, we will host four large events for city-wide and nation-wide worship events and gatherings. In October, we will welcome the Painters, Prophets, and Poets Conference once more, with world-renowned authors, painters, and poets coming to speak. We are a community center. It is amazing how this large, beautiful building is now being used to help us do ministry by supporting our budget. God took what could have been a burden and turned it into a blessing.
