Digging Deeper into "Christmas - Why We Need a Savior"

- 1. What's one Christmas tradition, movie, song, or treat that you look forward to every year—and why?
- 2. For you personally, does Christmas tend to feel more joyful, stressful, or bittersweet? Why?
- 3. Read Matthew 1:18–25 together. What stands out to you about Joseph's response to Mary's pregnancy?
- 4. Why do you think God intentionally chose Joseph—a man described as righteous and humble—to be Jesus' earthly father?
- 5. The angel tells Joseph to name the child Jesus. Why is the name so important in this passage?
- 6. How does knowing that "Jesus" means "The Lord saves" deepen your understanding of the Christmas story?
- 7. The sermon walked through several "heroes of the faith" (Noah, Abraham, Jacob, Moses, David). What did they all have in common despite their great moments?
- 8. Why do you think God included the sins and failures of these heroes so honestly in Scripture?
- 9. How does seeing the brokenness of biblical heroes help you understand your own need for Jesus?
- 10. Read Romans 3:23 and Romans 7:24–25. How do these verses explain why Jesus had to come?
- 11. The "Door of Humility" in Bethlehem requires people to bend down to enter. How is that a powerful picture of what it means to receive salvation?

- 12.What does pride look like in subtle ways when it comes to admitting our need for Jesus?
- 13.The sermon said, "If we can't admit our need for Jesus' salvation, then we can't be saved." Why is humility so central to the gospel?
- 14.According to John 3:16–17, what was God's primary motivation for sending Jesus? How does this challenge common misconceptions about God?
- 15.In what ways do you most relate to Paul's struggle in Romans 7—wanting to do good, but still falling short?
- 16.How does understanding Jesus as your Savior (not just a historical figure) shape how you approach Christmas this year?
- 17.As we celebrate Christmas, how can your life point others to the true gift of Jesus—at home, work, or in your relationships?
