



During a wait, it's easy to become discouraged, to feel impatient, and to chafe at circumstances and passing time. We worry that the wait will never end or that the outcome may be tragic. However, when we trust God and place the wait's outcome in His hands, He provides the hope that sustains us. God is working for our good during a wait. He will fulfill His purpose for us even when circumstances seem grim. He is able to do far more than we ask or imagine. He is intent on accomplishing His will here on Earth—both now and forever. Sometimes God uses a wait to develop strength of character in His children. We can practice patience and obedience and look forward to giving him glory for the work that He accomplishes in our wait. God will meet us at the end of our wait—and also during our wait.

God, waiting is so difficult. Please give us hope to sustain us during this time.



Dear Friends in Christ,

I am a Doctor and best-selling author who has appeared on NBC's Peacock Network. Well, this is all technically true, but each of these sound way more impressive than they actually are. I am a Doctor, but not a medical doctor. I'm a Doctor of the Church. I completed my Doctorate of Ministry degree in 2022, and so far my thesis has been read by all of about seven people. My children often tell me that I am a doctor, but not the type of doctor that actually helps anyone.

I am technically an Amazon best-selling author, but that again, is not all that it seems. A colleague and I developed an Advent prayer journal and workbook for Advent 2024. We gave it away for free. Since it was long and required a lot of paper to print, we also self-published it on Amazon. Amazon chose an obscure category to place the book in, marketing it to pastors (thinking that pastors would buy it in bulk for their churches). We dominated our Amazon category for the month leading up to Advent. Yet, that is still a very obscure category. The book currently is slightly better than the 2,000,000th most popular on Amazon.

My appearance on the Peacock Network? I attended a professional wrestling show in 2015, and can be seen in the background. Yes, my television appearance is cheering the Prince of Pretty, Tyler Breeze.

Recently, I was reading *The Imitation of Christ*, a small book written centuries ago by an obscure monk named Thomas. Thomas, early in the book, points out that when we reach the Kingdom of God and stand before God, all our accomplishments, all our learning, all the things we use to raise our egos, will be meaningless. The only thing that will matter—did we live a life of faith?

One of the blessings from moving is I've recently put my hands on every item I owned and had to ask—how important is this really? Our lives can sometimes be like that as well. We build up accomplishments and comforts, only to find they are ultimately meaningless.

Yet I don't raise this as a criticism, but rather as an opportunity. Much of what we do may seem more important than it really is—like a degree, a best-seller, and a television appearance. What is truly valuable—as the Apostle Paul says, knowing Jesus fully—is still readily available. It is never too late for us to open our hearts more to the Holy Spirit, and for the Holy Spirit to change us, removing what separates us from God, and bringing us closer. To truly know Jesus—that is what is truly important. I hope and pray that in my time here, we together, all grow to know Jesus more.

Are you like a lot of Christians who wish they could understand scripture better? Most Bibles in America sit unread, collecting dust. Could yours be one of them? That can change. Faith Church is offering you a way to “get” the Bible so that it all clicks!

On Saturday morning, September 20th, our friend Chuck Hildbold will take us on a “walk” through the first part of the Bible to learn the major people, places, and events of the Old Testament. Chuck is a certified instructor with Walk Thru the Bible and will guide us in a highly engaging, dynamic, and memorable event that will give clarity to God's Word and allow us to make the connection between His story and ours.

The otLIVE event that Chuck leads is a unique way to experience God's story like never before. It uses several modes of instruction (hearing, seeing, moving, interacting, and repetition), to help folks learn and retain the big picture of the whole Old Testament – and have fun doing it! We promise! In just three hours we'll grasp how the creation story and all the other familiar stories weave together and lead us to Jesus and the New Testament. By noon that day everyone will be able to recall in chronological order the OT's stories in less than 2 minutes.

Bring members of your family to join members of our Faith Church family – and others! - for a morning full of fun, learning, and blessings! This isn't just for adults; kids aged 8 and older enjoy otLIVE, too. Parents are to accompany their children. Although the group will be on our feet at times, sedentary folks can fully participate as well.





Interest in adult classes is growing, praise God! **All adults wanting to participate should register now** so that we may order adequate study guides.





When Sunday School classes at Faith Church resume on September 7th, the Beacons of Faith Class will begin reading **IMMERSE** The Reading Bible. The **IMMERSE** series is designed to provide a fresh Bible reading experience. Instead of customary curriculum study guides, class members will each have the **IMMERSE** Bible (NLT) in a simplified reader-friendly format that replaces chapters and verses with natural literary breaks. With **IMMERSE**, God's story is inviting to read.

Over 16 weeks, the Beacon Class will be reading the first volume, "Messiah" which will take us through the New Testament. There are 5 daily reading assignments each week. In our Sunday gatherings the class will discuss the material we've read with open, honest conversations. Together we can experience transformation through the Scriptures.







A VIEW FROM THE PEW

Home –

Perhaps you've seen the Tunnel to Towers commercials of the war-torn veterans who tell their stories. They've received disabling injuries in battle and now are grateful for the organization's gift of a smart house designed to accommodate their physical limitations. Each one invokes the word, "Home," as the comforting, safe place they desire – the home meant to be a quiet dignified retreat of independence.

The theme of home struck me these past few months as a number of relatives, friends, and church family members have been moving to other locations. I have no doubt there's anxiety and stress as persons leave one community and take up residence elsewhere in a new place with unknown challenges facing them. Regardless of face time and texting, leaving familiar social groups is difficult. Whether a household has seven individuals or one, it is still home.

Even if not actually making an address change, there are other "moves" in a person's life when they have shifts in relationships or jobs. Life is full of challenges when all someone might long for is constancy and acceptance. Such circumstances could be a time when believers might offer them encouragement, affirmation, and support. When we prayerfully do so, we are **Sharing Christ's Love Through Faith.**

It seems the concept of "Home" is important to God, for the Bible is peppered with references to it. After an enslaved life in Egypt, God's chosen people were led with His "cords of human kindness and ties of love" to a special land of milk and honey. They were promised a new start: a home that would give them a self-sufficient respected life. They'd be free of oppression and free to worship Yahweh and pass on the story of His redeeming love and gracious provision.

Scripture also records that Our Heavenly Father placed His own Son in a home setting for the nurturing experience of a loving family life. Jesus often conducted His ministry in individual's homes where His works and teachings received heart-felt appreciation and praise. It was in home churches that the earliest Christians heard and accepted the gospel message. One day children of the Lord will be a part of His glorious kingdom where we'll live in anticipation of the eternal home He is preparing for us.






