


Bibles for Kenya—A Giving Opportunity to Support Our Partner Churches and Pastors in Kenya

Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight.

~ Proverbs 3: 5-6



"Or do we need, like some people, letters of recommendation to you or from you? You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, known and read by everyone. You show that you are a letter from Christ, the result of our ministry, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts." (2 Corinthians 3: 1-3)

In the first century, itinerant preachers often carried letters of recommendation before entering a new area. The Apostle Paul wrote such letters, but seemingly did not carry them himself. Critics of Paul used this against him. Yet Paul writes here that he does not need letters, because the letters of recommendation for the Gospel are written on the hearts of believers.

This passage holds deeper meaning for me. When I was a seminary student, I served a church in Ada, Ohio. My grandfather served a church about 20 minutes away in the late 1970s/early 1980s. Someone in the church handed me a newspaper clipping of an article he had written for the local paper referencing this passage. My grandfather passed away in 2001, before I had even considered ministry. I know I have missed some names that probably should be listed! As Paul wrote, you yourselves are a letter, written on hearts, known and read by everyone.

Our world features an overabundance of what John Wesley called, "Almost Christians." These are people that claim the name of Jesus, but do not have the Holy Spirit in their hearts. 

I recently revisited a favorite book on prayer titled Lord, Teach Us to Pray, by Margie Burger. In a chapter on listening, Margie shares that it means, "to give ear, to hearken, to give heed." In the context of listening in prayer and learning to hear the voice of the Lord, she writes "one helpful amplified definition says that hearing involves the physical act of hearing with our ears, the mental activity of processing the sounds and understanding what is said in our minds, followed by the action of obeying what was heard in our lives. Hearing, understanding, and obeying is a full definition of listening. Since prayer is a conversation with God, listening is an important tool in our prayer life."

God speaks in a variety of ways: through Scripture—in our thoughts, visions and dreams, or spiritual pictures—through other people like spiritual leaders and friends—and sometimes in circumstances. In every case, spiritual discernment must be at work, and a close relationship with God is key to recognizing His voice.



When I reread this chapter, it woke me up again. It reminded me INCLINE YOUR EAR, that every part of my life belongs to the Lord - not just my prayer HEAR, THAT YOUR time and going-to-church. We each have the awesome opportunity to be in a close relationship with the God of all creation, and when BAIAH 55:3. 83V we do, he will speak into our lives. We just need to listen!



A VIEW FROM THE PEW

Psssst. -

On Good Friday 2024, I was working hurriedly in the kitchen to prep our Easter turkey. Our Saturday was booked to the hilt with other plans, so by having the entrée and most of the sides done ahead of time, I'd only have to warm everything in the oven on Easter and have a much less harried day with the family. As I prepared the meal, I'd been watching the clock because Mr. Hilty had set our departure for the church at 5 PM to allow him to get all in order for the Tenebrae Service that evening. I was relieved that by midafternoon the turkey was carved and in the refrigerator with the stuffing and gravy. I would have barely enough time to shower and throw some dinner together.

Just one more thing to do: I ran over to the pantry to get a Ziploc bag in which to freeze the turkey carcass (makes good soup!). As I yanked the bag from the top shelf, my elbow came down on the release handle of the fire extinguisher mounted on the inside pantry wall. Then I heard IT: Pssssssst. *Oh, no No NO NO!!*

I ran outside where Dave was relaxing in a lawn chair after having mowed the yard. In a frenzy I incoherently tried to report what had happened. And... He calmly turned his head to look at me, questioned my urgency, and then slowly got up and ambled through the garage. By the time we opened the door to the kitchen, there was a light fog filling the room, and he (truly!) asked, "Are you sure it discharged?" My mind screamed: WHAT?! Don't you see the mist falling on everything?!?!

Dave got the leaking fire extinguisher off its bracket and took it away. Not only did half the kitchen now have a dusting of powder, so did every single can, box, packet, etc. of food on the pantry shelves. And it was 3 PM.

I didn't know where to start the clean-up, but I certainly didn't want that powder tracked everywhere else in the clean ready-for-company house. To ease my panic, Dave's suggestion was this: "Shut the pantry doors and I'll take care of it tomorrow." Say, what?! I was waiting for him to quip – a la the Wizard of Oz - "Pay no attention to what's behind the doors." At least he wisely didn't ask, "What's for supper?"

When it comes to things of faith, I wish I could say that I respond with the same urgency whenever I hear a "psssst" from the Holy Spirit. But how often do I just amble around and don't take immediate action after getting a nudge from above. The excellent study Pastor Ron led this past Lent on R. A. Torey's book, *The Person and Work of the Holy Spirit* taught me – among many other things – that the power and work of the Holy Spirit graciously points out our mis-steps and also alerts us to avoid certain situations. The Spirit wishes to keep us from doing wrong, urging us, as well, to respond in righteous ways so that we are **Sharing Christ's Love Through Faith** and bring Him glory.

The way I see it, if it's important enough for my heavenly Father to get my attention, it would be best if I didn't ignore any psssst He sends my way. If I hadn't reacted to the sound of the discharging fire extinguisher, the fallout could have been so much worse. When the Holy Spirit convicts us, we are wise to not delay to confess and repent our sin; otherwise the dirt just gets worse. Our merciful Savior is ready to wipe away all the dusty residue we've accumulated in our defiant or careless behavior. God's desire is that we accept Jesus' powerful work to clean up even those things we hide behind closed doors. Then we can truly enjoy a restored ready-for-company relationship with Him.

Things That Can & Can't Be Shaken

The ground may not physically move, but the Lord is certainly doing some shaking. Political alliances. financial systems, and ethical standards are all being allowed to wobble. We are seeing the flimsiness and decay of structures upon which we've based our national pride and hope. Even personal lives are not immune to shock waves. Families are in crisis, and many marriages are buckling. Sadly, people have too often built lives on the weak cornerstones of their human wisdom, goodness, and ingenuity. But there is only one secure foundation: Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 3: 11)

God always has a purpose for allowing upheaval in His ordered creation. Among other things, He is shaking the church out of apathy and self-focus, reminding us not to trust in the temporary structures of this world. Rather, we are to rest upon the firm foundation of God's steadfast love and salvation.

As the Lord's ambassadors on earth—and the only ones standing on firm ground—we have a responsibility to offer real hope to those whose foundation is unstable. No job, government, or even religion can give a person long-term security. A relationship with Christ is the only lasting refuge.

Scripture says that the Lord is sovereign over all things. (Psalm 103: 19) He has the power to change our lives. We can't allow outside influences to affect our trust in Jesus Christ. His power does not ebb and flow along with our confidence in Him. Regardless of how we feel, God is always in control.

Being God's Servant

Henry T. Blackaby & Claude V. King, pp. 24-25, 29-30

To be involved in God's work, you must be a servant. Many Scripture passages describe Jesus as God's Servant. He came as a servant to accomplish God's will in the redemption of humanity. God wants to work through His servants. God wants you to allow Him to mold and shape you into the instrument of His choosing. Then He can take your life and put it where He wills and work through it to accomplish His purposes. God will look for and reward faithfulness, whether the person has been given responsibility for little or much.

The call to salvation is a call to be on mission with God as He reconciles a lost world to Himself through Christ. This calling requires that you be a servant of God. Jesus gave you the best model of servanthood which was being both humble and obedient. As a servant, you must be moldable and remain available for the Master's use.

Even though you may consider yourself to be an ordinary person, God will prepare you, and then He will do His work through you, revealing Himself to a watching world.

We must cooperate with the Holy Spirit's work. The Holy Spirit releases His power the moment you take a step of faith. Obedience unlocks God's power. God waits for you to act first. 


