Dear Friends,

The advantage of laptops, mobile phones, and modern technology is I can set up a temporary office anywhere. Yet, now this space is "mine," so to speak. I was able to begin to move my books onto the bookshelves and set up the office in a more permanent setup.

It is not the books, the laptop, the e-mail address that makes the difference. They are merely representations. I am committed to this place.

Recently, I was speaking to some friends that used to attend what I consider my "home church." When we attended there, before I was a pastor, it was a strong church with a thriving young-adult ministry. In the years since, the church has changed significantly. It is much smaller now, and most of my friends have left. Some have struggled to find another church. While it is more possible now than ever to watch worship online, this is not truly what it means to be a Christian.

John Wesley famously said, "There's no holiness without social holiness." What he meant was this: we are created to live in community together. We are called not only to assent to grace and love, but to actively love those around us and show them grace. We are called not just to attend a church, but to serve and make it our own. It is like the difference between hosting my mobile office as I travel, or rooting myself in the office at 305 Freeport Street. God calls us into a covenantal relationship. It is the difference between "attending" a church, and "being" the church.

We have a great many people that serve faithfully in our church. To all of you, I say "thank you." We could not continue to be the church without you. Yet, this fall season, as everything is changing, I invite us all to reflect. How is God calling us to root ourselves and serve? After all, since it is a new season, what better time than now? I am putting down roots, and overloading the bookshelves with books. Let us join together and commit to serving God here in new and spectacular ways!

On September 7, 2025, the *Beacons of Faith* Sunday School class for adults will start a 16-week study of "Messiah," the first volume of *IMMERSE The Reading Bible*. 

Restoration—

Over the last 10 years, Dave and I have been observing the drastic changes to an area of Sinnemahoning State Park in Cameron and Potter Counties, PA, known as 40 Maples. The park has always been a favorite place for us as we biked on the 5-mile Lowlands Trail which parallels the First Fork of the Sinnemahoning Creek. Close to 40 Maples, the trail cuts away from the creek into thick forest, leading to a wildlife blind by a small stream where we would observe waterfowl, turtles, and furry critters. My kind of heaven!

The idyllic area, however, slowly began to change. The huge white spruce trees that dominated that section of the park were being attacked with a virus. Then an invasive growth of aptly named "mile-a-minute" vine (it seems to grow that fast!) overtook the already diseased trees. Majestic evergreens were dying off each year, and it was sad to see healthy undergrowth disappear under a dense canopy of vines. About four years ago, we noticed blue blazes painted on the trunks of good trees. We learned the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources began a project to remove all the dead and diseased conifers in a 75-acre area to restore the native habitat. The work was long and at times ugly as trees were felled and chipped, and undesirable plant life was bulldozed and burned.

By the summer of 2024, the former woodlands near 40 Maples were no longer recognizable. Instead, there was open landscape with smoldering piles of debris and charred turf. The once healthy land went through a lot: first devastated by disease and overtaken by bad vegetation, it then required aggressive measures to arrest the situation where all manner of wildlife suffered. So harsh, but then...

Our visits to Sinnemahoning in 2025 brought smiles to our faces. 40 Maples is definitely different. A section of dense dark rotting growth is gone; however healthy maple, cherry, nut, and other hardwoods remain (all with blue blazes!). The blackened earth has been seeded and is giving way to green shoots of native grasses and plants, thanks to the sunlight that now reaches the ground. In July we were treated to seeing a group of 9 elk grazing on the forage planted by the DCNR. The planned restoration has begun!

Restoration. A beautiful thing to see unfold. Just like God's story we read in the Bible. The Creator's original perfect garden was tainted by the wiles of a serpent, and mankind was quickly overcome by destructive influences. But our Heavenly Father already had a plan in place to bring restoration to sindarkened lives. The Bible tells us that the fouled garden experience of Genesis is being restored and will culminate in a pristine garden experience described in Revelation. In between are stories that may seem harsh when our Holy God rightly responds to mankind's willful rebellion. But we're shown that our Heavenly Father always acts with justice for His people's good to graciously restore the repentant ones to Himself.

While we look forward to the new heaven and the new earth, God wants to do His transforming work in our lives today. In the midst of a sick world, those who trust in the saving work of Jesus are marked as His own for His good purposes. Believers are empowered by the Holy Spirit to help arrest evil in its tracks so that God's grace shines in dark places. When we are **Sharing Christ's Love Through Faith**, we are broadcasting the seeds of the gospel and invite all to enjoy His restoration. That's a plan that beats the DCNR's, hands down!

- We hosted a "Meet & Greet" in July to celebrate our new relationship with the Hanovers.






