

## **Classroom Sessions**

## **Family Sessions**

Family sessions are a time for families to gather together to study and apply God's Word. Families are free to do these studies at any day/time that is convenient. The study may be done all at once or over the course of a few days. Family sessions take roughly 1 hr. to complete.

## **Objectives**

- Gain appreciation and understanding of the Holy Scriptures
- Understand the central teachings of the Lutheran Church
- Express willingness and ability to confess the Christian faith
- Understand the church is the Body of Christ and it functions through service to one another
- Identify appropriate service both in the church and the community, and accept the responsibility to fulfill that service
- Understand Christian growth is a lifelong process – a pattern for a life of faith
- Understand Christian growth takes place through worship, fellowship, discipleship, ministry, and evangelism
- Integrate the Bible and the Christian tradition into their lives.

## **Curriculum**

These three years (6-8<sup>th</sup> Grade) build on each other and will concentrate on:

- Six Chief Parts of the Christian Faith
- Memorization of 25 Key Bible Passages
- Training in Reading the Bible
- Training in Personal Devotion/Disciplines
- Training in Servanthood and purity

## **Assignments**

- Attend Sunday Bible class and Discipleship Training
- Memorization and Bible Readings
- Sermon Summaries
- Quizzes, tests and papers as assigned

## **Sermon Summaries, Bible Reading & Memorization**

Students in 6<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> grade are expected to complete sermon summaries, Bible readings, and memory work during the program year.

**Sermon summaries:** The forms for sermon summaries are available in the narthex at both campuses and also on the Discipleship Training webpage. 6<sup>th</sup> graders should complete 10 summaries, 7<sup>th</sup> graders should complete 15 summaries, and 8<sup>th</sup> graders should complete 20 summaries.

**Bible Reading and Memory work:** The schedule for Bible reading and memory work may be found at the end of this booklet. The forms for documenting this work are available in the narthex at both campuses and also on the Discipleship Training webpage

## **Sickness**

If your child is ill, please keep him/her home from classes. A call to the teacher or the church office will be appreciated so we know what to tell his/her classmates. We would also like to be able to pray for your child when absent.

## **Weather**

In the case of inclement weather, an email will be sent out by 1pm on the day of class to alert you that class is cancelled. The email will be sent to the address given on your children's registration form. If no email is sent, assume that we will have class as normal.

## **Discipline Policy**

Should disciplinary action be required, the following steps will be taken:

1. Parents will be notified when a problem occurs. A phone call will be made, and the situation will be discussed in detail.
2. A meeting of the parents, student and teacher will be a final step in finding a solution.

# Family Session #1: Digging Deeper in the Lord's Prayer

## BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Family Sessions are a way for parents and students to grow together as a family in God's Word. Here are a few suggestions before you begin:

- You may consider reviewing the last family session from the fall term ("Praying as Jesus Taught Us") before doing this family session.
- Share Scripture readings between family members. Feel free to adjust the questions and discussion based on the age and ability of your child.
- Children who are not in Discipleship Training (either too young or already confirmed) are welcome to participate in the family session.
- The study can be completed in one sitting or over the course of a few days.
- You are free to join with other families to do the study together.

## GETTING STARTED

Have someone offer up a prayer for God's blessing on your time together.

- How has God blessed you this week?
- What are you praying about this week?

## DIGGING DEEPER INTO THE LORD'S PRAYER

Have each person in the family share the following:

- What do you like about the Lord's Prayer?
- What do you find challenging about this prayer?

### **Give us this day our daily bread.**

- How does God provide for your daily needs?
- Who does God use to provide your daily needs?
- Read and discuss Psalm 145:15-16

### **Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.**

- How does Christ's forgiveness help you forgive others?
- Why is it sometimes difficult to forgive other people?
- Read and discuss Psalm 51:1-2

### **Lead us not into temptation.**

- How does God keep you free from temptation?
- How does God keep your family free from temptation?
- Read and discuss 1 Corinthians 10:12-13

### **Deliver us from evil.**

- How has God in the past delivered His people from evil?
- How does God deliver your family from evil?
- Read and discuss Psalm 121:7-8

### **WRAPPING UP**

Close by praying the Lord's Prayer together.

*Our Father who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.*

## **Family Session #2:**

### **God Uses Ordinary Stuff to do Extraordinary Work**

#### **BEFORE YOU BEGIN**

Family Sessions are a way for parents and students to grow together as a family in God's Word. Here are a few suggestions before you begin:

- Share Scripture readings between family members. Feel free to adjust the questions and discussion based on the age and ability of your child.
- Children who are not in Discipleship Training (either too young or already confirmed) are welcome to participate in the family session.
- The study can be completed in one sitting or over the course of a few days.
- You are free to join with other families to do the study together.

#### **GETTING STARTED**

Have someone offer up a prayer for God's blessing on your time together.

- How has God blessed you this week?
- What are you praying about this week?

#### **GETTING TO KNOW THE SACRAMENTS**

Have each person in the family share the following:

- Do you remember your own baptism?

- Even if you cannot remember your baptism, what impact does it have on your daily life?

Read 2 Kings 5:1-14 and John 9:1-7. Both of these sections of Scripture show God using something ordinary (water, dirt) to do something extraordinary. Why do you think God would use such ordinary stuff? How would these events have been different if something extraordinary had been used instead?

### **Bread + Fish + Jesus = Extraordinary Miracle**

- Read Mark 6:30-44
- What ordinary things were used?
- Who had the power to transform these ordinary things into something extraordinary?
- Why do you think Jesus said to the disciples, “You give them something to eat?” (Mark 6:37)

### **Wood + Nails + Rock = Extraordinary Salvation**

- Read John 19:16-18
- What sort of ordinary things were used in the crucifixion of Jesus?
- What extraordinary work did God do in the midst of these ordinary things?

### **What else does God use?**

- Read 1 Corinthians 1:27
- What are some seemingly basic and ordinary things that God uses in extraordinary ways today?
  - Hint: Bible, Baptism, Holy Communion
- Do we sometimes overlook these ways in which God works because they use common and ordinary things?

### **WRAPPING UP**

Close by praying the Lord’s Prayer together.

*Our Father who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.*
