

Stephen Ministry

What is Stephen Ministry?

• Stephen Ministry is Christ Caring for People through People. Everyone faces periods of crisis, transition, or difficulty. During these times, a caring relationship with someone who will faithfully listen, empathize, pray with and for them, and encourage them with Christ's love and care can be a tremendous benefit. Stephen Ministry ensures no one walks alone.

Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2, NRSV).

• Stephen Ministers are laypeople — Christian men and women — trained to provide one-to-one care to people experiencing a difficult time in life, such as grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, relocation, or separation due to military deployment. People receiving care are referred to as care receivers. Stephen Ministers are people with a compassionate heart who have been equipped with the skills to listen,

encourage, and offer support when someone is in need.

- Stephen Ministers typically have one care receiver relationship at a time and meet together once a week for about an hour in a confidential listening relationship. Stephen Ministers care, pray, encourage, listen, and visit faithfully to bring Christ's love and to hurting care receivers. Stephen Ministers recognize that they are merely care givers, where Christ is the ultimate Cure Giver.
- Stephen Ministers receive over 50+ hours of training with continuing education to be equipped to serve and provide prayerful support for their care receivers.
- Stephen Leaders recruit, select and train
 Stephen Ministers; connect Stephen
 Ministers with people who need care;
 while providing ongoing supervision and continuing education.

When did Stephen Ministry begin?

• Since 1975, Stephen Ministry has equipped God's people within 14,000 congregations across the globe. Likewise, 600,000

laypeople have had Stephen Ministry training with more than 1.5 million people receiving Christian care from a Stephen Minister during tough times.

In 2009, St. John's Methodist established a
Stephen Ministry with a few members who
received Stephen Leader Training. Since that
time, Stephen Leaders have trained many
Stephen Ministers within the church in order
to provide one on one Christian care to
members as care receivers.

How do Stephen Ministers serve?

- Stephen Ministers are matched with individuals by Rev. Butch and a Stephen Leader for a confidential one on one caregiving relationship.
- Stephen Ministry shares a 4 part series of Grief books to help people who are grieving.
