CAMPUS GUIDELINES

We ask all families to help create a peaceful and respectful environment during the Feast:

Youth Curfew: Children and teens (17 & under) should return to their family's campsite by 2:00 AM nightly.

No Smoking or Vaping: The AOY campus is smoke-free and vape-free.

No Illegal Substances: Possession or use of illegal drugs is strictly prohibited.

Alcohol Use: Permitted only at your own campsites, by adults 21+, and *always* in moderation. Excess drinking and drunkenness are not acceptable before Yahweh.

Respect the Grounds: Please clean up after yourselves and your children, and treat all facilities with care.

Failure to follow these expectations may result in removal from the property. Let's honor Yahweh and one another in all things.

FEAST UPDATES

Stay in the loop!

SAFETY & AWARENESS

To help maintain a family-friendly and safe environment:

- Drive 5 MPH at all times.
- Park carefully—watch for children.
- Do not invite children into your tent or camper unless they're part of your household—*Let's avoid even the appearance of impropriety as we honor Yahweh together.*

CLEANLINESS & FACILITIES

- Camp is divided into zones for cleaning assignments.
- Contact your cleaning lead based on the area where you are camping out.
- If you are not camping, please pitch in and contact one of the cleaning leads.

PETS

No pets allowed, except for certified service animals.

SERVICES & WORSHIP

- Services: 11 AM daily, 3 PM on High Days.
- No dancing during services—you're welcome to dance elsewhere.
- Children 10 & under must sit with an adult.
- No running in buildings.
- Nurseries are available in the Sanctuary & Dining Hall.
- Dining Hall & kitchen are locked during services.
- Please adhere to the dress code and remember we ask for shorts to not be worn in services by anyone 10 years old or older

GENERAL GUIDELINES

ACCOMMODATIONS

Our campground is available for Feast guests at a modest cost to cover utilities and maintenance. The campus is divided into five zones, each with Neighborhood Hosts to assist you as needed.

- Tent campers may use the ice machine, fridge, and freezer in the Bathhouse.
- Additional ice machines are in the AC Lobby and Dining Hall.
- A laundry room is located on the east side of the Bathhouse.
- Campfires are permitted (pending county-issued burn bans), please use **ABOVE-GROUND** fire pits and do not dig holes for fires.

MEAL PREPARATION

- Everyone is responsible for their own meals.
- On High Days, 10/8 and 10/15 and Sabbath 10/11 there will be pitch-in meals with the Assembly providing a salad bar. Please bring food to contribute.
- Throughout the week, invite others from around the camp to share a meal together.
- Grilling under the small pavilion is allowed, but please clean up after yourself.
- The kitchen is open AFTER services until 9 AM. It is closed each morning and therefore you should plan on a cold breakfast.
- Toaster and microwaves will be available in the dining hall.
- Please observe Biblical clean food laws.
- **The Activity Center kitchen is closed during the week.**

Enjoy pool, ping pong, pinball, and more. Children under 12 are not allowed in the Game Room.

DRESS CODE

(applies at all times while on campus)

We value modesty and aim to create an environment that is respectful, family-friendly, and honoring to Yahweh. Please take a moment to review the following modesty guidelines:

GENERAL GUIDELINES (AGES 10 & UP):

- Shirts should fully cover the midriff; necklines should be modest and not expose cleavage, even under lace or sheer material.
- Dresses, skirts, and shorts should reach the knee—even when wearing leggings. (*9" inseam is recommended for shorts*)
- Shorts are not permitted during formal worship services.

PROHIBITED CLOTHING:

- Sleeveless, strapless, spaghetti strap, backless, or cold-shoulder tops and dresses
- Clothing that reveals undergarments, including bra straps
- Tank tops, muscle shirts, and form-fitting items like leggings, yoga pants, or compression shorts (unless worn under appropriately long garments)
- Clothing with inappropriate slogans, graphics, or references to alcohol or tobacco
