Join Us for Mānoa Valley Church's 2024 Family Camp!





Important Information for MVC Worshippers by Roger Au

What will you do if faced with an Active Threat at church? Imagine someone intruding upon the sanctity of Sunday worship with a weapon and intent to harm. On February 18, 2024, over 40 congregants participated in an Active Threat presentation provided by **Danny Tengan**, Hawaii Conference of the United Church of Christ Disaster Coordinator. Danny has decades of emergency response experience with the State of Hawaii and as a military Reservist. He also provided training tailored to our campus for all our staff members.

What do we do when an active threat arises?

- We can alert any member of the worship team when we recognize a potential threat. We must be aware of our surroundings and recognize strangers to our campus who appear out of place, clothed inappropriately for our weather, or otherwise acting strangely.
- We can call 911 immediately and alert police to the location of the Active Threat.
- We can take action using the strategy Run-Hide-Fight recommended by the FBI, HPD, UCC and the Department of Homeland Security.
 - 1. Immediately exit the sanctuary away from the threat. Potential routes are through the end of the Haawale Place cul-de-sac, or to the Manoa Fire Station, or along Huapala Street.
 - 2. If evacuation is not possible, find a place to hide, preferably behind large structures such as pillars, or under pews, out of view.
 - 3. As a last resort, and only when life is in imminent danger, attempt to disrupt and/or incapacitate the attacker. Danny play-acted an attacker and challenged: "What are you going to do?" Distract the attacker by throwing any object. Act as aggressively as possible against him/her. Commit to your actions do not fight fairly. THIS IS ABOUT SURVIVAL. Throw items and improvise weapons. Yell!



What is MVC doing to improve our security?

The gate to the preschool will soon be replaced with a hydraulic auto-closer, exit panic hardware, and an entry cypher lock, which will help protect our precious students and staff. The Trustees are currently developing a project to increase security by extending the existing fencing to enclose the sanctuary. We are also repairing and improving the security camera system.
