Rotten: In a world of fake smiles, quick tempers, and shallow love, we're all producing something. Every word, every choice, every action plants something in someone's heart—either life-giving or toxic. But the Spirit grows something different: love when hate comes easy, joy when life feels heavy, peace in the chaos, patience when you're pushed, kindness in a cruel world, goodness when nobody's watching, faithfulness when others walk away, gentleness in a culture that shouts, and self-control when everything says give in. 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DISCUSSION

God's Faithfulness to Us Scripture: Lamentations 3:22-23, Deuteronomy 7:9, Psalm 102:25-27

One of the aspects of God that is most affirmed in Scripture is His faithfulness. We live in a world that often fails us, but God never fails. He remains faithful and consistent through our highest and lowest of moments. God has bound Himself to us in a covenant relationship, which is a faithful relationship that He establishes with us and is rooted in His promises, His character, and His love. In other words, our relationship with God is not dependent on our effort to perform perfectly for God so that He might love us in return. On the contrary, when we belong to Him, the relationship with Him is based on His faithful commitment to extend His grace and love to us each and every day. His unchanging character and faithfulness are what gives us hope in an ever-changing world.

•	How have you seen the world change dramatically in your lifetime? (think about how people view truth, family, religion, and morality)

• Why is it important that we understand that God is unchanging in His nature and unending in His faithfulness? (think specifically about how this relates to the world we live in)

• What Scriptures give you comfort in the fact that God's faithfulness provides hope in your life today? How does this truth remind you of how you have personally experienced God's faithfulness?

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DISCUSSION CONTINUED

Our Faithfulness to God Scripture: Matthew 25-14-27, Philippians 1:6

This week's message highlighted the above Parable of the Talents in Matthew 25. We all have been given skills, talents, and possessions by God. Our responsibility is to use them in ways that will accomplish God's purposes. Jesus teaches the need for faithfulness, and He will reward faithfulness. We want to steward well our possessions, time, and abilities so God and His kingdom will receive the greatest possible return. We heard this week that "faithfulness [to God] isn't about being perfect; it's about doing something with what God gave you." Often, being faithful to God begins with the small stuff in our lives.

• What "small things" in your daily life might be training grounds for faithfulness to God? In other words, where are you experiencing "spiritual consistency?"

• Describe a time when you have wanted to give up, but you persevered because God demonstrated faithfulness in your life?

Our Faithfulness to Others Scripture: Proverbs 3:3-4, Ruth 1:1-22

The story of Ruth is one of the clearest pictures of faithfulness that is lived out in human relationships. It is a story of covenant love, loyalty in hardship, and God's redemption through everyday obedience. Expressing the fruit of faithfulness in our relationships means that we choose the relationship over convenience. When we do, we reflect the character of God, who is always faithful to His people even in life's worst moments.

• How can we express faithfulness like Ruth in our everyday relationships?

• How can our consistency and faithfulness to one another in the church be a witness of God's character in our community?
