



tn Grk "brothers," but the Greek word may be used for "brothers and sisters" or "fellow Christians" as here (cf. BDAG 18 s.v. ἀδελφός 1, where considerable nonbiblical evidence for the plural ἀδελφοί [adelphoi] meaning "brothers and sisters" is cited).



Paul asks the Philippians to follow his example, not because he has achieved perfection, but because he is struggling in the same race that they are running (cf. 1:30).11 Quite naturally, therefore, he identifies himself with them by the use of an affectionate and humble term, "brothers."




