


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¹⁵"Shall we pay or shall we not pay?" Mark 12:15a (NASB95)

Of all the Roman taxes, this poll tax or census was especially distasteful to the Jews of Palestine and a constant source of irritation and frustration (Josephus, Ant. 17.308). First imposed in 6 ce, it immediately provoked a (failed) revolt under Judas of Galilee (Josephus, J.W. 2.118; Ant. 18.1–10, 23–25), and later gave rise to the Zealot movement that culminated in their revolt of 66 ce and the catastrophic destruction of Jerusalem four years later. For these revolutionaries, the census was a litmus test of loyalty to God.

He has come to refashion, for He it was that fashioned us at first; and He is Himself asking for His money, as Cæsar for his. Therefore He says, "Render unto Cæsar the things that are Cæsar's, and unto God the things that are God's:" to Cæsar his money, to God yourselves. And then shall the truth be reproduced in us."
