



A Markan Sandwich of Two Trials





The effect of this way of telling the story (in contrast with Luke, who records Peter's denial before Jesus' hearing) is to throw Jesus and Peter into sharp contrast. Each will be under pressure, but whereas Jesus both in his silence and in his final dramatic utterance will stand firm, Peter will crumble. Jesus will go to his death, but with his witness to his mission undimmed;

Peter will escape, but at the cost of his integrity as a disciple of Jesus. It is a study in witnessing under pressure, in how to do it and how not to do it. As such, it could be expected to offer serious food for thought to Mark's readers as they assessed their own faithfulness and built up their strength for witness in a potentially hostile world.




The definition of identity is the "condition or character as to who a person or what a thing is; the qualities, beliefs, etc., that distinguish or identify a person or thing."



Identity is that sense of being and selfunderstanding that frames our actions, communicates to others who we are, and sets the agenda for our acts. We live out of a sense of identity. It may be unexpressed or even unconscious, but it still determines us. Image is not identity; image is what we project to others, an attempt at how we would like to be seen, which may have little to do with what we really are.



How shall we who died to sin still live in it? 3Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death? ⁴Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

Our brains were designed to respond to group identity in order to help us act like "our people." Our right brain contains the control center that interprets our group identity and uses it to shape our inner character. The orbital prefrontal cortex (on the right side of my brain behind my eye) is dominant for integrating my current situation in life with who I am—in real time. Every one-sixth of a second our right brain tries to answer the questions, "Who am I? How do my people act now?"



If my control center is working smoothly, my circumstances are integrated with my group identity. I spontaneously act with joy and peace. If my control center desynchronizes, I forget who I am and how to connect with those around me. I stop acting like myself. Even though I am a Christian, I stop acting like one.


