

ESTABLISHED FOR MORE

We weren't made to stay comfortable or live only for ourselves. God establishes us—not just to build our own lives, but to be part of something bigger. In this series, we'll discover how God calls us beyond what's familiar and invites us to join His mission in the world. From giving and praying to going and sending, we're called to be a people established for more—so that every nation can know Him.

DAY 1

LIVING FROM BLESSING

Reading: Genesis 12:1-3, 15:1-6

God called Abram (later Abraham) to leave everything familiar and journey to an unknown land. Despite the uncertainty, God promised to bless Abram and make him a blessing to others. Like Abram, we're called to live from a place of blessing, not constantly seeking more.

Reflect on how God has already blessed you. How can you shift your perspective from "wanting more" to recognizing and living from the blessings you already have? Consider ways you can be a blessing to others today, even in small acts of kindness or generosity.

DAY 2

GOD AS OUR GREAT REWARD

Reading: Psalm 16:5-11, Philippians 3:7-11

The pastor emphasized that God Himself is our greatest reward. Often, we focus on material blessings or specific answers to prayer, forgetting that our relationship with God is the ultimate gift. Today, meditate on what it means to have God as your "portion and cup" (Psalm 16:5). How does knowing Christ surpass all other gains in your life?

Spend time in prayer, simply enjoying God's presence and expressing gratitude for His love and nearness.

DAY 3

BREAKING THE POVERTY MENTALITY

Reading: 2 Corinthians 8:1-15, Luke 21:1-4

Devotional: A poverty mentality can hinder our generosity and limit our view of God's provision.

The Macedonian churches gave generously despite their extreme poverty because they understood God's abundant grace. Similarly, the widow gave her all, trusting in God's care. Examine your heart – are there areas where you're holding back due to fear or a sense of lack? Ask God to help you see His abundance and to give you a heart of joyful generosity, no matter your circumstances.

DAY 4

PARTNERING IN GOD'S KINGDOM WORK

Reading: Matthew 28:16-20, Acts 1:8

The Great Commission calls us to participate in God's work of reaching the world. This isn't just for missionaries or pastors – every believer has a role to play. Reflect on the unique gifts, resources, and opportunities God has given you. How can you use these to advance God's kingdom? Whether through prayer, giving, or direct involvement, consider one specific way you can engage more deeply in mission work this week.

DAY 5

LIVING AS BLESSED

Reading: Ephesians 1:3-14, 1 Peter 2:9-10

In Christ, we have been blessed with every spiritual blessing. We are chosen, adopted, redeemed, and sealed with the Holy Spirit. This is our true identity – royal priesthood, holy nation, God's special possession.

Today, intentionally walk tall" in this identity. How does knowing you are profoundly blessed by God change your outlook on life's challenges? Look for opportunities to declare God's praises through your words and actions, living as one who is truly blessed and called to bless others.
