College Hill Café: We are thrilled to announce the successful completion of the College Hill Café, making it more accessible to our community. This project has not only enhanced our physical space but also strengthened our connection with the local community.

Strategic Hires and GSM: In 2023, we welcomed valuable additions to our team. The appointment of an Executive Director of Operations and a Kid City College Hill Director has brought fresh perspectives and

strengthened our ability to serve the diverse needs of our church family. We also saw growth in our GSM ministry as a result of the leadership of our Ministry Residents and Family Ministries team.

25 families in crisis were helped via Care Portal!

Over 80 kids were served - that's \$27, 866 in economic impact!



The Village was bustling in 2023. Our breath is taken away as we stop to reflect on all that has happened. What an absolute testament to Jesus working powerfully through His people. God brought the right people at the right time, with the right funding to meet the needs over and over again. To God be ALLLLL the glory!

To recap some of 2023: we started monthly Village Volunteer gatherings because we need to better link up in this hard work and started Village Prayer gatherings because we are desperate for the Spirit to fuel our work. Along with those gatherings came a room to gather, which we aptly call The Family Room. It was made beautiful because Village volunteers came together, and the beautiful work of the Spirit in families continues when we gather there. Other events this year included hosting a Connect Night for weary foster and adoptive parents and holding an informational dinner for those interested in stepping into this space. We also took part in a Sunday panel discussion during Foster Care Awareness Month and made a clear invitation into this space on Stand Sunday in November. Throughout the year, dozens upon dozens of incredible Village volunteers came alongside those in our body who said the brave yes to foster care or adoption, while others went way out of their comfort zones to serve families in our community teetering on the brink.

The Lord is on a mission to restore family in this earth - and what an HONOR it is to Him in that mission. We seek to operate as a family, working with His Holy Spirit to restore what is broken and to welcome image bearers we encounter into a larger family. In our context, this is done through foster care, adoption, and making space in our lives to love where safe, healing love has been elusive. Ultimately our hope is that anyone we meet becomes part of HIS forever family. The work is heavy and hard and slow but His nearness and care is as tangible as the physical needs we so often meet.



WHAT A YEAR OF GROWTH IT HAS BEEN!

Our community breakfasts (every Sunday and Wednesday morning) at Connecting Point have continued to be a space where people feel a sense of belonging and friendship. Not only have numbers of people almost doubled from last year, we are also seeing so many other beautiful stories taking place. In addition to those intentional gatherings, we've been able to continue serving our community each month through the food pantry and events like the Summer Block Party and Fall Festival!

be glad in it. I thank God for forgiving me of all known and unknown sins. I thank God for this grace, mercy, and favor on me. And I thank Him for calling me out of darkness and into his marvelous light.

All my life, I've been unnoticed, abandoned, overlooked, misused, mishandled, and underestimated. But God's unconditional love brought me this far, to this day and this hour, to be who you called me to be. I've had some sleepless nights where I have cried myself to sleep but through it all God was with me. I've lost many loved ones. These are the loved ones who were the closest to me who cared about my direction in life—my father, my grandparents, aunties and uncles, cousins, daughter, brother, sister, godmothers, pastors, etc. I miss them all, but what I received from them in each season brought me to the front line to believe in myself. Two years ago I was at my lowest. I felt like I was dead, and had not died yet. I wanted to give up hope on me. I asked God to take my life because I felt I had not only disappointed myself and loved ones, but that I had disappointed God Himself after He had been so good to me all my life. But just as I was about to throw in the towel, I had just enough faith left in God and myself to go on and see what the end would be.

I heard about this place called the Connecting Point. I was hungry, I was tired, and I didn't know where to go or whom to trust with my pain other than God himself. I believe in my heart God led me to the Connecting Point. When I entered the doors I felt love. I was given something to eat. Later on, on Thanksgiving last year, I was able to sing again. I am a singer for God. I was dirty, meaning unclean in spirit and body. The people there at CP heard my story, and they put their love in action. They let me bathe twice a week, they let me wash my clothes, they gave me three blankets so I wouldn't freeze to death. They brought me kerosene oil to heat the room I slept in. they sent me gifts of water jars so i could bathe when they were not open. They prepared food three times a week, breakfast, lunch, and groceries to hold me over for the rest of the week for two weeks until they give it away again. They helped direct me where I could get clothing. They paid some of my bills. And most of all, they showed me great love from the heart and welcomed me like i was someone special. I walked into CP November 16, 2022. Since then, I have begun to believe in myself. I am working at LU and I am back in church. I feel confident about the direction of my life. It is all uphill now, now turning back. There is nothing back there. I am 2.5 months clean of drugs and alcohol. I give my biggest thanks to God, creator of heaven and earth, because He made it possible for me to meet these wonderful, godly, compassionate people. This is the beginning of my journey. I still have a lot to endure. I live without running water, and my electricity in my house doesn't carry enough voltage. I am paying my house taxes off with the part-time job God provided for me and paying off my car payment slowly because it was repossessed. And to the end of my story, I am overly grateful to God our Father for taking care of me and loving me unconditionally and giving me this second chance to do his will in Jesus name.



Total Operating Expenses: \$676,482


*6 month Shortfall: -\$ 24,970

^{*}The six month shortfall was due to primarily from unforeseen expenses related to the College Hill Cafe and main bathroom renovations. Shortfall was remedied in July of 2023 with IRS - Employee Retention Tax Credit deposit.



As we stepped into the new fiscal year commencing on July 1, 2023, the projected income stands at \$1,520,000 against a budget of \$1,513,375. This budget, while ambitious, sets the stage for significant growth opportunities for Gospel Community Church. By December 2023, halfway through the fiscal year, the church initiated a generosity campaign to align with the budget and raise funds matching a generous gift for renovating the first floor of Connecting Point. A total of \$41,000 was successfully raised for the Connecting Point project and construction is fully funded barring any unforeseen expenses. Construction is now underway for the renovation project at Connecting Point. Lord willing, these renovations are expected to conclude by March 2024. Anticipating the need to maintain alignment with the proposed budget for the fiscal year, another generosity campaign is in the works for the upcoming Easter/Spring Season.

^{*}The monies remaining are allocated for the winter and spring expenses of the 2024 budget year. These monies include funds from the IRS - Employee Retention Tax Credit deposit in July of 2023.

From January 1st to June 30th, 2023, Gospel Community Church experienced a distinctive phase. This period marked the transition for GCC to adopt a new fiscal year. During these six months, we witnessed a notable increase in contributions compared to the preceding year. Additionally, substantial progress was made in the repairs and renovation of the Cafe at College Hill. Completion of the Cafe and restroom project is poised to make the GCC College Hill Campus a valuable asset, benefiting both our congregation and the wider community. Thus far, we've hosted a Christmas Party for teachers from Robert Payne Elementary School, organized various events for the College Hill Community, held our annual staff Christmas party, and provided space for other non-profits to convene.

We eagerly anticipate how the Lord will enable us to further serve the community!


