NOTES

The first goal is to approach all scripture with humility and prayer.

One of the most amazing things about Ad-nai is His amazing ability to completely bless His people. This weeks Parsha begins with one of His promises to do just that. It begins in Deuteronomy 7:12:

12“Then it will happen, as a result of your listening to these ordinances, when you keep and do them, that Adonai your God will keep with you the covenant kindness that He swore to your fathers.”

Notice that these words come in the text that explains how Israel is supposed to reject the way of the people of Caanan and live only according to Ad-nai's commandments. The result of choosing Ad-nai's ways over the worlds ways is that Ad-nai will keep us with His covenant of kindness.

We often think in terms of the Torah being a covenant of Laws and restrictions but Ad-ani thinks of it in terms of kindness. Maybe we should allow Him to change our perspective?
