The first goal is to approach all scripture with humility and prayer.

In this week's Parsha, we find Moses is turning over leadership of Israel to Joshua. When Moses speaks to Joshua about leadership, he doesn't give him a list of things to do or not to do.

He doesn't tell him how to act or how to speak. He doesn't provide a long explanation of why Moses did what he did so Joshua could follow his example. No, what Moses said was:

Deuteronomy 31:6:

"Chazak! Be courageous! Do not be afraid or tremble before them. For Adonai your God—He is the One who goes with you. He will not fail you or abandon you."

Moses knew that if we are courageous and trust Ad-nai, we will have the strength to make all of the other choices in life the right way.
