This week, we are reading about Abram being called by Ad-nai to leave his home and move his family to the Land of Promise. We can read what Ad-nai said to Abram in Genesis 12:1:

1Then Adonai said to Abram, "Get going out from your land, and from your relatives, and from your father's house, to the land that I will show you. 2 My heart's desire is to make you into a great nation, to bless you, to make your name great so that you may be a blessing.

Imagine that you are sitting in your home and you hear a voice telling you to get up and move to a place you have never been to. Not only have you never been there, but when you leave, you don't even know where you are going. You only know that Ad-nai is going to lead you there. This may seem like a really big step of faith that Abram took.

But, the truth is that each of us take the exact same step of faith when we become believers in Ad-nai. We hear Him calling us, but we really don't know where we are going in this life, where we will end up living, what we will end up doing, and who we will end up with. What we do know is that as with Abram, Ad-nai's heart's desire is that we are blessed and are a blessing.
