IDENTITY: FOLLOWER OF G-D'S WORD 5 MINUTES	Ask: Why does G-D call us out of our comfort zone?	Discuss: What is the nature of G-D?

IDENTITY: DOER OF G-D'S WORD 5 MINUTES	Who we are is largely dependent upon what we do; we act and obey G-D knowing HE is always with us.	Ask: What would your life look like if you 100% knew G-D was right besides you?
GAME/ACTIVITY	Who is G-D?	<<-Same yesterday, today, tomorrow, and forever.

The first goal is to approach all scripture with humility and prayer.

In this week's Parsha Vayera, we find one of the most wonderful events in the entire Bible. In this week's parsha, Ad-nai has dinner with Abraham.

Just imagine: if you were sitting in front of your house and you looked up and right in front of you stood Ad-nai. How cool would that be? Ad-nai standing in your front yard! When this happened to Abraham, Abraham invited Ad-nai to have dinner with him.

Now, before you think this could never happen to you, remember that Ad-nai is already everywhere. So, in reality every time you have breakfast, lunch, or dinner, in truth, Ad-nai is there with you.
