

# What a question!

## Materials:

3x5 cards of two (or three) colours

Parsha Lesson

Whiteboard for keeping score

1. Read and discuss the weeks parsha.

Stack 3x5 cards alternating the two (or three if you have a very large group) colours. Have a volunteer pass out a 3x5 card to each person around the tables. Each person should write down a question based on the lesson. After they have written a question have them break into teams based on the colour of their card. Then have them pass all the cards forward.

2. Shuffle the cards, and put them facedown alternating the colours in the stack. Tell them you are going to read a question from their cards. If they think they know the answer they must shout out: "What a question!" and raise their hands. You will call on the youngest person who raises their hand first. Tell them that the team that correctly answers the most questions, and gets the most points will win. Ask the groups if they are ready to play?

3. Turn over the card on the top of the pile and ask that question. Call on yeladim, and award points for a correct answer. Now here is the twist: After the team has been awarded 2 points for correctly answering, ask; "Can anyone expand our understanding?" and call on an additional person who can talk more about that question and either expand on it, or introduce another related item

As an example if the question was "Where were the tablets of testimony placed?" and the answer was "In the Ark." Finding out the Ark also held Aarons rod that budded is expansion, finding out that the Ark was gold inside and out is related, and finding out that his dog Fluffy had puppies is cute, but irrelevant. Award 1 point to the first person to meaningfully expand the answer. Continue until all the questions are answered and you have a winning team.
