Many Ways to Give

There are many ways to give, the tried-and-true Sunday offering placed in the black boxes located in the lobby of each worship venue is one way- but here are some other options for you to consider.



Online Giving

Giving via credit or debit card through the church's website (centerpointroseville.org) has never been easier. At the top of the website's homepage there is a button labeled "Giving". Just click there and it will take you to a screen that will ask you to set up a login account and password.



Text Giving

Text giving is a very convenient way to support Centerpoint, just text Give 25 (or any amount) to (916) 945-9677, then follow the prompts. The first time you will have to set up your credit or debit card but then you are ready to go.



Electronic Funds Transfer

Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) is the transfer of funds between banks. All you need to do is fill out an EFT form, return it to the church, and your offering will automatically be withdrawn directly from your checking or savings. The EFT form is available on our website (centerpointroseville.org) click on "Give", you can also request a form from Kelly Harder at the church office.



Bill Pay

Your bank's bill pay system is another way to give to the church. Most banks offer a bill paying method just set up the church as one of your payees. Then giving money to the church is as easy as pushing a button from your bank's website.



IRA Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)

If you are 70 1/2 years old or older you can make a QCD from your IRA without counting the distribution as taxable income. The donation must come directly from your IRA to Centerpoint through your trustee. You can't withdraw the funds and donate them yourself. The maximum amount you can contribute in a year is \$105,000, or \$210,000 for married couples.



Stocks/Appreciated Securities

Centerpoint has a brokerage account that stocks can be transferred to, and the proceeds come directly to the church. Donate before you sell and receive a charitable deduction for the full fair market value and owe no capital gain tax on appreciation.
