**Small Group Questions**  
**Week of March 17, 2024**

**Icebreaker:**

*Highs and Lows: Share a “high” point of your week and a “low” point of your week. Something that was encouraging and something that was a bit of a bummer (this can be as simple as a burnt meal; it doesn’t have to be something horrible unless you want to share).*

**Discussion Questions:**

1. Read Genesis chapter 17: What are the promises of the covenant in this chapter?

Look over Genesis 12:1-9 and Genesis 15: How does Genesis 17 expand our understanding of God’s covenant with Abraham?

2. What are the covenant stipulations in Genesis 17?

What are Abraham and his descendants’ responsibilities in the covenant?

What would it look like for them to “walk before [God] faithfully and be blameless” (17:1)?

3. What does it look like for you to walk faithfully before God?

What areas of your life can be challenging to walk in faithfulness?

4. Why do people struggle with waiting on God’s timing?

What are the things in our culture, our upbringing, our churches, etc. that contribute to our impatience?

5. Share about a time when you had doubts about God’s timing; or share about a doubt you are currently facing with God’s timing.

What were some things that helped you to walk faithfully in the midst of that doubt? Or what do you wish you would have done or known to have walked faithfully?

6. Why do we struggle with doubts about God’s ability to use us to accomplish His purposes?

What would it look like to step out in faithfulness even when you have doubts about your own abilities?

7. In Genesis 12, God frames this covenant with Abraham that He will bless them in order to be a blessing to the world. What would it look like for the church to be blessed to be a blessing?

How could Centerpoint be (and how is Centerpoint) a blessing to our community?
