Question #4. Is there a potential better path forward for young widows? (vss. 11-15)

Question #5. Are there other women available in the church to care for them (vs. 16)?

Look

Look at 1 Timothy 5:1-16. How many verses are given to demonstrate how Timothy should interact with older men? Younger men? Older and younger women? Why do you think Paul devotes such a large number of verses to the issue of handling the care of widows? (c. Acts 6:1-7) What might have contributed to the early church having so many widows in need? What might be some of the differences in our current church and culture today? Do you think we have allowed the government to replace the church in caring for the needy? Yes or No. Why? What about the future?

What new policy change is Paul exhorting Timothy towards in regards to caring for the widows? We all have limited resources in a world with unlimited needs; how we do we discern the best way to help people?



Digging

Deeper

Read Genesis 1:26,27. A Christian ought to think differently in regards to the most vulnerable in our society. Why? This was established clearly, concisely, and repeatedly in the first chapter of the Bible. What are the implications of the "Image Deo" in our worldview towards the weak, poor, elderly, unborn and disabled? How does this contrast with how other world religions view the vulnerable?

Read James 1:23-27. We are told two things make our "religion" pure and undefiled. What are those two things? What is so "pure" about helping the most vulnerable in our society? How does "visiting" the widows and orphans in their distress fit into the large context of vss. 23-27?

Read Galatians 6:7-10. We are commanded to do good to everyone but especially to those inside the Church? Why would care within the Body take precedent over those outside the Church?
