

Blessed Advent and Merry Christmas to you St. Mark's!

This is the last Lion's Wing of 2022! The year has flown by and I am so very much looking forward to this Advent and Christmas with you. Advent is a special time in the church year when we prepare for the birth of Christ, and it's a time slow down a little when given the chance to reflect, pray, and prepare.

With family expectations, Christmas concerts, and other gatherings making us feel even more spread thin, this may seem impossible. I am not asking us to do tons more, nor am I asking us to cut out a bunch to make time for reflections. I am suggesting that we take small sips from the cup. A quiet moment, a short



break, where you offer a prayer or a verse from scripture. Maybe in the morning or before you end your day, to keep you going or to allow you to stop, breathe, and rest.

There will be several opportunities this Advent to help with our preparation for the birth of Christ the King. Such as:

- 1. **Advent Stations:** We will be again doing the Advent stations of the cross on Wednesdays during Advent with a brief Eucharist. On Thursdays, we will be having soup and bread starting at 6 p.m. If you are willing to provide the soup and or the bread, please sign up in the Narthex. This will be followed by a discussion about the Living Compass Advent study.
- 2. **Nativity:** We will also have our new Nativity set which will be out off the circle drive in front of church this Advent through the Christmas season.
- 3. **Special Services:** Our Christmas Eve service will be at 7pm on Saturday December 24 and we will have Christmas Day service on Sunday at 9 a.m.

I believe if we focus our hearts during Advent, it makes Christmas even more powerful.

God bless your Advent and Christmas and I look forward to journeying into the new year with you!

Christmas Stocking Project

These are some of the Christmas stockings we create here at St. Mark's. Each one is made according to the buyers wishes, such as color palette, sports interests, jobs, hobbies, etc. What makes each one unique are the jewelry additions. There are lots of beads and sequins but it's the jewelry that can't be duplicated. If you're doing spring cleaning this year and run across broken bracelets or a lost earring or things you no longer want would you consider donating them to the stocking project? We will again be hosting a Christmas cookie walk at St. Mark's. The difference between a cookie walk and a cookie sale is the presentation. At our cookie walk customers are presented with a box and a glove. As they walk around the banquet tables in the fireside room they are able to choose whatever cookies they want. Once their box is full it is brought to the counter and weighed. The price and their name is written on the box by the weighers. After they have filled as many boxes as they want, they take their already priced boxes to the cashier and make payment.

A few details that make this sale so successful are: we collect your cookies on Friday and put them out on the trays so all that needs to be done on Saturday is to remove the covers. We put the boxes together on Friday so no one has to wait for a new box on Saturday morning. If needed, we assign a parishioner to walk with a customer to hold a box for them. We have people available to help carry boxes to cars. We have music for the early birds. All of this takes many hands to put together and we hope there will be many from St. Mark's willing to work together to make it a big success. Another upside is that this is a fast fundraiser. The customers are in and out in one hour and after cleaning and putting tables back in place we too are done by around 10 am. If you can get into the church you can bring cookies a day or so earlier. Someone will be at church on Friday to collect your cookies between 9am and 5pm. The church will also be open on Wednesday and Thursday evening for services if that is more convenient. On Saturday December 10, we arrive at church at 7am to finish setting up, and open the doors for the early arrivals. Kevin Luebke has graciously offered to come at that time to play violin music for those waiting in the narthex. I am coming at that time just to hear him play.

Remember that the theme we use for this sale is, "the more we bake, the more we make". If you need help with purchasing supplies you can talk to Fr. Mike about a gift card. Please help make this a GREAT cookie walk.



St. Mark's Episcopal Church Vestry Meeting Minutes October 23rd, 2022

Members Present: Fr. Mike, Fred Ellis, Joann Ellis, David Drexler, Linda Zamzow, Jody Langfeldt, Christine Merrill, Kevin Luebke, Maison Yaroch, Ken Peters

Meeting Started: 10:57 AM

Fr. Mike opened with prayer

Linda moved that the minutes from September be accepted Christine seconds. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

1. Jody asked about 142 – Church/Parish Hall Contents – and whether all of our new things (electronics, stained glass window, etc.) have been taken into account. The answer is "not yet"

Horicon Bank - \$28,480.17

- 410 Current Pledges Contributions Under Budget \$17,928.85
- 412 Giver of Record Over Budget \$7,500
- 413 Loose Offerings Under Budget \$245.01
- 420 Int.on Invest/Operations Over Budget \$442.88
- 512 Rector's Pension Over Budget \$424.26
- 513 Rector's Health Insurance Under Budget \$0.01
- 514 Reactor's Travel Over Budget \$1,904.79
- 541 Diocesan Convention
- 1. We've never budgeted for hotels before, only convention costs. Fred asked if we want to add it to the budget so we're prepared
 - 2. Linda thinks that 100% should be covered otherwise you're never going to get anyone to go
- 3. Fr. Mike suggested we budget high. He doesn't want anyone to **not** run because they can't afford to. And nobody will complain about being **over** budget
 - 4. Fred will add another \$1,000 to this section of the budget
- 542 Heat, Lights, Water Over Budget \$962.30
 - 1. Fred asks Jr. Warden's if we should raise the budget another \$2,000, making a total of \$6,000. They said yes
- 544.4 Internet Over Budget \$4652.36, due to the new website
- 1. Ken has offered up a second computer he has but doesn't need. He's having it cleaned up and cleaned out and it will be put in Maison's office
- 611 Organist Over Budget \$300
- 612 Administrative Assistant Under Budget \$1,758.90
 - 1. Ken asked if the cookie sale will go on this year's budget: Yes, it will

Kevin asks - regarding the Admin. Assistants - if we have a written-out description of what the Administrative Assistants do. Linda and Jody say that we do, Maison hasn't seen it, it will be looked for and hopefully found. Christine moves to accept treasurer's report

Fr. Mike gets a raise at the beginning of the year, according to the Dioceses

Jody asks if we've heard anything about the audit. Nothing has been heard

New Correspondence - N/A

Choir Update - still having trouble getting everyone together. there's 10 people.

Altar Guild Booklet - Linda has not met with priest since last meeting. Carol is interested in being an altar guild member & doing altar linens

Advent 2022 Devotional - Jody and Joann asked if we wanted to get some this year. We must buy a minimum of ten.

Fr. Mike thinks we should. Will fall under line item 570 - Church Education

Joann makes a motion that we order 10 of the books and she will write an article for the newsletter.

Linda seconds. Motion carried.

Jody motions to move the Jr. Warden's report up

Linda seconds. Motion carried.

Jr. Warden's Report

A/C Update - it's in. Dave did check off air filter, which previously was not, but he will be covering that

Stained Glass Lighting Update - need 4 LED fluorescent lights, going to frame it in wood, want to sand it down a bit and paint it. should be done by the time the bishop comes. Dave thinks we should put something up with information on the window, like where it came from and the history

Fr. Mike's Fun Fact - The stained-glass window is called a "coke-bottle mosaic"

Found 4-foot statue of St. Mark, Ken could do all the touching up

Parking Lot - contacted two places. Trophy Asphalt Sealing total price came out to \$8,000. \$7,000 for paving, \$750 for painting. General Asphalt / Poblocki Paving total price came out to \$3,567. Price includes the painting.

Joann makes a motion to accept the Poblocki Paving contract

Kevin seconds the motion. Motion carried.

Snowplowing - Linda will be contacting someone she knows

Jody brought up that we used to have brochures that described all the stained-glass flowers and what they mean.

Linda thinks she still has a copy of one (edit: It's suggested that maybe we bring that back)

Rector's Report

Stonehouse - We're within 5 items of where Fr. Mike thinks it needs to be. He walked the vestry through it, showing the site as it is currently on his laptop. Fr. Mike, Andrea, Jim, and Maison will be having a meeting about the multimedia section of the site

- 1. Half of us don't have bios and/or pictures in
- 2. Fr. Mike wants a redo of his picture
- 3. He's also adding to the Involvement page. Asked if Meals and Wheels should be added as one of our outreach missions as there are a lot of members of St. Mark's involved.
 - 4. Took out porch visits because we don't do them
- 5. Kevin suggests the Outreach Ministries page content be broken up more, possibly with pictures to make it "less jumbly"

Nativity & Sound System are the two things Fr. Mike still wants to work on this year

Nativity - 48in \$5,495 - fiberglass - we'd just buy the figures - it would have a "creche" (??) this year but we don't have to buy it - if it doesn't get build this year, it could be put on plywood for this year - on the outside of the church, on the bell side. Will be sitting down with the Jr. Warden's to figure out designing / placement. Fr. Mike suggested we get the figures this year

Linda motions to go ahead with buying the nativity

Kevin seconded it. Motion carried.

will come out of line item 553 - Misc.

Paul Lampert's Window - Betsy decided she doesn't want it near the big window, it will go behind the scrip table **Ministry Grant Update** - we got the grants \$1,500 + and extra \$500 = \$2,000

Tech Update - Nov. 1sts metro sound will give us an estimate and suggestions on cameras, flat screen, sound system. It will be way more than we can currently afford but it gives us a direction for the future

Online Store - it was supposed to be up by Friday, it still isn't but Fr. Mike is staying on it

St. Mark's Adventure - 14 people signed up for the October 30th adventure. the date of the next one needs to be moved as it is currently planned for holy week

We are chamber members; they did grandfather us Oct. Nov. Dec. into next year. That's an extra 3 months for the cost of a year

Mitch's Concert Update - he loved being here and he wants to come back. 40 people attended, 100+ people watched online. we made \$400 out of \$900, the remainder came out of a discretionary. Fr. Mike wants to get other church's with us on it next year so we can have it at swan park

No new ministries / initiatives until into next year

Two Person Prayer Team Idea - tabled for next year

Grief Group - is over for the year, looking at coming back together in the spring because the group didn't want it to end

Talent Auction Update - depositing \$600 all on talent auction items, but still money is coming in. Fr. Mike guesstimates \$800 - \$900 range in the end. We'll do it again next year

Stewardship - We need to see the expenses but can't do anything yet. Around \$128,000 is the guesstimate Fred gave. Fr. Mike is the biggest expense we have. Pledge cards should be sent out as soon as we can get them out. Ideas for new pledge cards tossed around, one that would also allow people to sign up for Time, Talent, Treasure. Will need a line for them to sign their name. For Treasure there would need to be an amount line. Will go out with the proposed budget & a letter. Maison and Linda will work on these. We should mail it to everyone physically, and put it on the website, and have some in the narthex. Proposed budget - or just A budget - must be done first. Pledges are not designed to cover all expenses

Cookie Walk - updates tabled due to Andy Harmon's death, but it's Saturday, December 10th. Maison and Linda will be working on the cards to send out


Scrip Update - \$252.75 this month, had several people order online
